News from the Town Office

Sixteen Ashland Fire Fighters responded to the two alarm fire at the Riveredge Marina on the evening of Sunday April 28th which is still under investigation. The Ashland Fire Department responded very quickly and saved much more of the property from being engulfed in flames.

The Ashland Budget Committee met on April 25th and made the following appointments: Mark Scarano, Chair; David Ruell, Vice-Chair and Fran Newton, Secretary. The Committee wrote to the Board of Selectmen and made a request that when the annual audit is received by the Town that there be ample time to review same to make any commentary. The Committee has alerted both the Selectmen and the Town Administrator of the financial documents that they will require each month as part of the reporting process to the Budget Committee.

The Town's Auditors have advised that a draft of the Financial Statement should be with us by the end of this week. There has been a slight delay due to some corrections to the report.

There was a disappointing turnout for Child Safety Day on April 27th sponsored by the Ashland Fire Department at the Elementary School, which was probably attributed to the fact that many families were on school holiday. However, Chief Heath and Fire Fighter Kendall B. Hughes were on hand to inspect children's car seats. Fire Fighters Brad Ober and Ingrid Heidenreich, with Ashland HEAL Bike-Pedestrian Committee member Joe Mazzone, were available to inspect bikes and helmet sizing. The Town office thanks them all for volunteering their time.

The Sunday morning 'Walk with Paul' has increased in size due in part to the warmer weather. Hopefully we shall see a significant participation as the weeks evolve. June 1st to the 7th is classified as "Walk NH Week" with the official kick-off beginning on May 31st with a walk in White Park in Concord. This is a State-wide health initiative centered on bringing Towns, Schools and Businesses together. The Ashland HEAL Steering Committee is encouraging the community to take part in this Walk NH Week and join the 'Walk with Paul' on Sunday June 2nd, meeting at the Town Beach parking lot at 8:30 am. The HEAL Steering Committee would welcome any feedback from the community walkers regarding the 'walkability' of the Town where they go, as this would assist in the preparation of their report to the State.

The Ashland HEAL Steering Committee has been very busy with the three initiatives in Town and has been invited to participate in the one year anniversary of the Grant award in Concord on May 8th. The Bike-Pedestrian Committee is to establish a "Re-Cycle" program that will entail donated bikes being restored to their original glory and returned to the community along with a bike helmet. This initiative is in its infancy but anyone willing to donate an old bike should contact Paul Branscombe at (603) 707-9370. More details on this program will be forthcoming in future Bulletins.

Members of the Ashland HEAL Steering Committee met with representatives from the Common Man restaurant last Tuesday to determine the direction the restaurant will go in supporting the healthy eating initiative.

NHDOT has confirmed that when the ramp closure takes place at Exit 24 **the detour will no longer run through Ashland** and into New Hampton. The detour for the Exit 24 South Bound On-ramp closure will now detour traffic up Interstate 93 to Exit 25 where drivers will see the exit to change direction and come South on Interstate 93. The State is requiring the contractor to complete the Exit 24 bridge work during 2013.

Emery & Garrett, the firm that monitors the condition of the Ashland Landfill, presented the Town Office with their 2001-2012 Post Closure Monitoring report. Overall, the cap is in excellent condition and performing according to its design. No methane was detected. The next report will be submitted after the end of the 2013-2014 monitoring period. There are four primary tasks that Emery & Garrett carry out annually: Groundwater level & Quality monitoring; Methane gas monitoring; Inspection of the Landfill surface and reporting to NHDES.

Town employee Health Insurance costs have risen by 6.7% over the 2012 rates. Effective July 1, 2013 the single increase will be \$46.34 monthly; the two person \$92.67 and the family \$125.11. These increases will be held through June 30, 2014.

A number of residents e-mailed the Town Office to find out why the water level in the river had gone down to uncharacteristic levels. This was done to accommodate work being carried out on the turbines.

On Monday the 29th the finishing touches to the Town Hall chimney were carried out by Red Mountain Construction. New flashing had to be installed to stop the elements from coming under the roof.

The Ashland Area Recreation Association (AARA) is hosting a Spaghetti Dinner tomorrow, Friday May 3rd, from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm at the Ashland Booster Club on Main Street. This event is a fundraiser for the tuition scholarship program for the Ashland Parks & Recreation Summer Camp Program. The cost is \$7 for adults and \$5 for children age five to twelve. The AARA has successfully moved the 'backstop' on the ball field to make it easier for younger children to play and have more room behind the 'backstop.' The AARA also donated brand new fencing to cover it and they wish to acknowledge thanks to Ashland Lumber for donating concrete and to our Public Works Director for his assistance.

The organization has also installed two garden beds located adjacent to the Booster Club to be used by the Summer Camp participants. Materials and labor were donated by Tree Solutions and the wood was cut as a donation by Sean's Rough Sawn Lumber.

The Board of Selectmen's next meeting is scheduled for Monday May 6th in the Library at the Elementary School at 7 pm where District 2 Senator Jeanie Forrester will be a guest speaker.
