

**Ashland Water and Sewer Commission Minutes**

**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM.

**NEW BUSINESS:** The Commissioners discussed the Woodard & Curran Design Proposal for the new Septage Receiving Station. The design costs will be \$195,000. Representatives of Woodard & Curran will review the proposal and costs with the Commissioners at the Commissioners weekly work session. They will also review the Septage Receiving Station Site Plan Review presentation before representatives of the Ashland Planning Board, Board of Selectmen and the Conservation Commission at a scheduled Public Hearing on Wednesday, October 4, 2017 at 6:30 PM.

Members of the Planning Board, Board of Selectmen and Conservation Commission have been invited for a Site Walk of the present Septage Receiving Station to see the existing station and to see where the proposed new Septage Receiving Station will be built. The Site Walk is scheduled for Wednesday, October 4, 2017 prior to the Public Hearing on the new proposed Septage Receiving Station Site Plan Review.

Tom Schwartz from Woodard & Curran is setting up a Huber demonstration for the second or third week in October in Berwick, ME.

The Commissioners are in receipt of the final report from Nobis on the status of the present lagoons. Rusty has reviewed the report and Dave Toth has reviewed the report.

The Commissioners reviewed the Site Plan Presentation of the proposed Septage Receiving Station that will be presented at the Public Hearing.

The Commissioners continue to work on the 2018 budget.
