Article 4: Support Staff Agreement To see if the School District will vote to approve the cost items included in a collective bargaining agreement reached between the School Board and the Plymouth Regional Education Support Staff Association, which calls for the following decrease in salaries and benefits:

Article 7: Operating Budget To see if the Pemi-Baker Regional School District will vote to raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session for the purposes set forth therein, totaling fourteen million, five hundred forty-two thousand five hundred nineteen dollars (\$14,542,519).  Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be fourteen million four hundred ninety thousand twenty-four dollars (\$14,490,024), which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Pemi-Baker Regional School Board, or by law or the governing body may hold one special meeting. In accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. This sum excludes the sums in Warrant Articles 2, 3, 4 and 5.
