



PARADE RULES

ASHLAND NH 150th CELEBRATION PARADE

SATURDAY, JULY 28, 2018, 2 PM

It is the responsibility of each participant in the parade to use common sense and abide by New Hampshire safety laws (RSA 265:108a) and these parade rules. The Committee reserves the right to remove any participant at its sole discretion. The Committee and the Town of Ashland is not liable for any injury or damage to any property, public or private, caused by or to any entry.

New Hampshire safety laws require, in part, that children riding on a vehicle shall remain entirely within the perimeter of the vehicle; if standing, shall be reasonably protected from probable injury if the vehicle suddenly starts or stops and there shall be at least one adult for every 4 children, not including the driver, so that each child is visible to a supervising adult. Such adult shall have means of immediate communication with the driver.

Every operator of every vehicle must be in possession of a valid motor vehicle operator's license. Every vehicle, including towed vehicles, must hold a valid registration and a valid state inspection certificate, if required by law.

Because of equestrian entries, no sirens or air horns will be allowed. No items may be thrown or handed from a float or any moving vehicle. Walkers along the sides of the parade route may hand out items as long as the speed of the parade is not impeded and being mindful that very small children may be among the recipients. No spraying of water. Music must not sound out other groups.

By participating in the parade, each entrant specifically consents to being photographed and/or videotaped for the benefit of the 150th Celebration Committee and agrees that all rights, privileges and ownership thereof shall be the property of the Committee.
