Hopefully it won't rain on the **Pleasant Street Dance** with music by the group, Club Soda, but if it does we will simply move it to the school gym. Would be fun to have old cars and trucks line Main Street so pass the word! Some classes are meeting at specific times for the **Alumni Day**, so check with your classmates. In the **L W Packard Ballfield**, following a **flag raising ceremony** after the parade, the Baker Valley Band will play, followed by the Tirrell-Wysocki, an Irish music group from 4 to 6 pm in the bandstand. The beard contest will be at 5:30 pm and a 150 Ceremony at 6 pm with music by Just Because afterwards. The Granite State Cloggers will be performing on the basketball court and Bryan Conway afterwards from 5 to 7:30. In other areas of the field there will be Stacey Lucas (Fig Tree Gallery) with face painting from 5 to 8 pm; from 4 to 6 pm, Andrea of the Ashland Post Office will be postmarking stamped envelopes with our special 150 postmark and we will be selling commemorative First Class stamps; Mo the Clown with his balloon fun, 3 to 7 pm; Jim Gleich, juggler 7 to 8 pm; a replica "Ashland Arch" for photo ops; watermelon for sale by the Ashland Woman's Club; cookout by the Ashland Community Church, wood-fired pizza, fried dough, onion rings, french fries, etc. all leading up to an overhead drone picture, song by the Piscataqua Rangers Jr. Fife and Drum; and the **fireworks** at dusk!

Of course, all boats, old and new, decorated or not, are welcome to join the **boat parade** on Sunday, July 29! Line up begins at 1 pm.
