I just wanted to thank Lee Nichols for arranging the visit on Tuesday to Freudenberg-NOK. Lee, Norm DeWolfe and I met with Roger Keezer, the operations manager at the Ashland facility. Roger stated Freudenberg-NOK is the largest company "no one knows about". This facility is part of the Freudenberg Sealing Technologies division. Roger spent about ninety minutes telling us the history of the company and how it came to locate in Ashland. He also talked about the changes at the plant over the years. Roger talked about having a difficult time getting applicants to even come for an interview to the Ashland plant because they perceive it as being too far north or too out of the way. Freudenberg-NOK has a substantial investment in Ashland and this was a great step in building a working partnership with them. Roger said he would be happy to attend the meet and greet we will be scheduling.
