Ashland Economic Development Committee report: Steve Felton of the Ashland Economic Development Committee (AEDC) presented an update of the committee. Chair Newton read a letter from Meredith Village Saving Bank (MVSB) regarding their sponsorship of the recent Ashland Economic Development Committee Summit held in November. Chair Newton thanked MVSB for their support. Mr. Felton went over next steps of the AEDC. Discussion followed regarding the summit.

First Session – You are hereby notified to meet for the First (Deliberative) Session of the Annual Town Meeting, to be held at the William J. Tirone Gymnasium, 27 Highland Street, Ashland, New Hampshire, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of February 2018, being Saturday at 2:00 pm. The First (Deliberative) Session will consist of explanation, discussion and debate of each of the following articles and will afford those voters who are present the opportunity to propose, debate and adopt amendments to each warrant article, except those articles whose wording is prescribed by state law.

Second Session – You are also notified to meet for the Second Session of the Annual Town Meeting, to elect Town Officers by official ballot and to vote by official ballot on the warrant articles as they may have been amended at the First Session, to be held at the William J. Tirone Gymnasium, 27 Highland Street, Ashland, New Hampshite on the 13th day of March 2017, being Tuesday, the polls to be open at 8:00 am and may not close prior to 7:00 pm to act upon the following:

**ARTICLE 2** No Tax Impact in 2018; Estimated Tax impact for 2019 is \$0.34 [Passage of this article shall override the 10 percent limitation imposed on this appropriation due to the non-recommendation of the budget committee.]

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,799,420 for the purpose of a road and utility reconstruction project on Thompson Street, High Street, and Smith Hill Road, and to authorize the issuance of not more than \$1,799,420 of bonds or notes in accordance with the Murricipal Finance Act (RSA 33) and to authorize the municipal officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon; Recommendations required (3/5 ballot vote).

Town Building Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund and Eight Thousand Two Hundred Fifty dollars (\$8,250) come from other grants and donations, if available, or from general taxation.
