- I. CALL TO ORDER** – The Town of Ashland Chairman of the Board Frances Newton called this meeting to order at 6:38 p.m. with a full board present; Vice Chairman Kathleen DeWolfe, Selectman Eli Badger, Selectman Leigh Sharps, and Selectman Casey Barney all signified they were present. Town Manager Charles Smith was also present for the meeting.
- II. PUBLIC HEARING** – the Chairman Newton opened the public hearing at 6:39 p.m. for public comment about the Ashland Library special bond warrant article to purchase the property on 41 School Street.
- a. Ashland Library Trustees were present: Chairman Alice Staples, started with a presentation about the importance of the town purchasing the property for the library. Alice stated that the current Scribner Building does not have enough room for books and projects, there are space issues for the library, accessibility issues to the building, and limited parking. Alice also mentioned benefits for a town creating a new library and purchasing the property on School Street. If so, it would be a symbol of a town’s success, it improves our infrastructure, it would become a place of connection for elderly residents whom rely upon the library. The new property would be a better location for the library, with its proximity to the school the library would better serve the kids and would be an opportunity for the town to reclaim a historic town landmark. Alice concluded by saying the trustees did look at other properties to move into, but the renovation costs were extensive, and this property was a great bargain compared to what other towns have been paying to purchase new libraries.
 - b. Amanda Loud asked about the annual maintenance and if the Library would need to expand staff? Trustee Mardean Badger the library would have to hire an additional librarian and as for overhead, currently Tri-County CAP (resident owner at 41 School Street) pays about \$16,000 year for heat, water, electric, etc.
 - c. Charlie Bozello asked about usage of the library. Trustees estimate they have about 1,800 items available. Exact figures are published in the town report.
 - d. Jenny Angel asked about expansion of library services. Trustees said with the new library they would expand services to the public.
 - e. Leigh Sharps asked if they would expand the computer room? Trustees said they currently don’t have enough space for people to use their laptops at the library, so they expect there to be an expansion with the new building.
 - f. Amanda Loud asked about future capital expenditures? Trustee Badger expects there to be minor renovations with the new building.
 - g. Ann Richards asked if the trustees have grants for this project? Trustee Badger responded that the library always tries for grants, but they are difficult to find when purchasing a new building.
 - h. Financing options were discussed - Tri County CAP have proposed a few owner/finance options. They also said the \$525,000 price of the building was lowest price they could offer. Tri-County CAP mentioned the total cost to refurbish the

Chairman Newton called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM with a roll call. Fran Newton, Kathleen DeWolfe, Eli Badger, Leigh Sharps, and Casey Barney present.

The Board held two public hearings as follows:

- I. Town of Ashland CDBG progress updates:
 - a. Lakes Region Community Developers/Harvey Heights; rehabilitation of 40 existing units of affordable housing (Ledgewood Estates Apartments): Rehab has included siding and insulation, electrical, plumbing and most kitchens and baths as well as upgraded life/safety systems. The project is 63% complete.
 - b. Presentation of findings of the CDBG study to determine the potential re-use of the L.W. Packard Mill/Ashland Properties: In summary, the building is in poor condition. Extensive modifications would be required in all parts of the building and site. Extensive work would be required to bring the building up to code; therefore, complete demolition would be recommended.

There were no comments from the public.

- II. Town of Ashland Warrant: The warrant was open to any questions of comments. Chairman Newton briefly summarized the warrant articles. Several concerns were raised about not including the Thompson Street project in this year's warrant. Newton explained that given the defeat of the article three years in a row, it would be unlikely to pass this year. However, DPW has plans to make extensive repairs to both Thompson Street and Smith Hill Road out of the highway capital reserve fund.

New Business: Chief Ulwick presented Officer Morretto with a commendation letter after receiving a letter of appreciation and gratitude from an Ashland resident for taking extra measures that likely resulted in saving a life.

There being no other business, the Board adjourned at 7:35 PM.

Boards expects that most department heads will speak to articles that impact their department. Town Manager Smith will be provided answers to questions, if asked, about the budget, capital reserve funds and unassigned fund balance.

IV. ADJOURNED – Board adjourned their meeting at 5:50 p.m. and are scheduled to reconvene on Saturday, February 1st at 10:00 a.m. for the Town Deliberative Session.

AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, a donation of an installed playground has been offered to the Town of Ashland, a New Hampshire municipal corporation with a mailing address of PO Box 517, Ashland, NH 03217; and

WHEREAS Game Time, a division of PlayCore WI, Inc., with a mailing address of 150 PlayCore Drive SE, Fort Payne, AL 35967, will be providing the playground equipment and design;

WHEREAS CMJ Construction, Inc., with a mailing address of 40 Fenton Way, Bangor, ME 04401, will be installing the playground equipment provided by Game Time on property owned by the Town of Ashland;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties stipulate and agree as follows:

1. Game Time shall provide all necessary equipment and design services for the construction of a playground as shown on the plan and photographs attached hereto as Exhibit A.
2. Game Time shall warrant all materials and workmanship as set forth in the GAMETIME WARRANTIES attached hereto as Exhibit B.
3. Game Time shall be solely responsible for hiring and supervising CMJ Construction, Inc. to install the playground as shown in Exhibit A.
4. Game Time and CMJ Construction, Inc. shall maintain insurance as set forth in the Certificates of Liability Insurance attached hereto as Exhibit C. Game Time and CMJ Construction, Inc. shall both name the Town of Ashland as an additional insured on these polices, on a primary and noncontributory basis, and shall provide proof of such before any work is done to install the playground. **GameTime will extend additional insured status for ongoing operations to Town of Ashland via ISO form CG 2010 04/13. Additional insured status for both ongoing and completed operations will be extended to Town of Ashland by CMJ Construction.** Game Time and CMJ Construction, Inc. shall also maintain workers compensation coverage as required by New Hampshire state law and shall provide proof of said coverage before any work is done to install the playground.
5. Game Time will assume all liability and responsibility for the work of CMJ Construction, Inc. in installing the playground (equipment and site work) and shall defend and indemnify the Town of Ashland against any and all claims, **but only to the extent arising out the negligent acts or omissions of GameTime or anyone for whom they are responsible**, regarding the equipment, design, or installation of the playground.
6. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Hampshire. Any claims relating to this Agreement shall be commenced in the Grafton County Superior Court in North Haverhill, NH.

The lifetime warranty refers to the life of the product as defined below and covers the product under normal use and proper maintenance; see exclusions.

LIFETIME LIMITED WARRANTY ON HARDWARE

GameTime provides a lifetime limited warranty against structural failure due to breaking or shearing which causes the product to become structurally unfit for its intended use; a lifetime limited warranty on stainless steel hardware against rust; and a one-year limited warranty on non-stainless steel hardware against rust; see exclusions. All testing of GameTime's hardware is performed under the guidelines of ASTM B117. The lifetime warranty refers to the life of the product as defined below and covers the product under normal use and proper maintenance. The cost of replacement due to scratching or cutting of certain hardware plating is not included in this warranty.

FIFTEEN-YEAR LIMITED WARRANTY ON ROTOMOLDED AND THERMO-FORMED POLYETHYLENE PRODUCTS

GameTime provides a fifteen-year limited warranty on rotomolded and thermo-formed polyethylene products and ten-year limited warranty on polyethylene handholds for structural integrity against damage due to breaking or splitting under normal use that causes the product to become structurally unfit for its intended use; see exclusions. In the event of a claim under this warranty, GameTime will replace the rotomolded or thermo-formed polyethylene product at no cost to the customer.

TWENTY-YEAR LIMITED WARRANTY ON TIMBER DÉCOR™ AND TIMBERS PRODUCTS

GameTime provides a twenty-year limited warranty on recycled plastic lumber products in normal applications against rotting, splintering, decay or structural damage directly from termites or fungal decay that cause the product to become structurally unfit for its intended use; see exclusions.

LIMITED WARRANTY ON NET CLIMBERS AND COMPONENTS

GameTime provides a five-year limited warranty on nylon-covered cable net climbers and components against structural failure caused by cable breakage; a five-year limited warranty on nylon-covered cable wear and deterioration resulting from defects in materials and workmanship; and a one-year limited warranty on nylon rope products. These warranties cover damage due to failure that cause the product to become structurally unfit for the intended use; see exclusions.

LIMITED WARRANTY ON INTEGRATED GTSHADE® PRODUCTS

GameTime provides a ten-year limited warranty on fabric canopies against tears, runs, cracking, mildew and color fading except for red, which has a three-year color warranty. Canopies have a limited warranty against structure failure due to wind of up to 90 miles per hour (mph) and structural failure due to snow and ice loading not exceeding five pounds per square foot. Fabric canopies are to be removed if winds are expected to exceed 90 mph or when snow or ice is expected. Fabric warranty does not cover damage resulting from chemical contact. All metal upright posts and support structure framing have a ten-year limited warranty against becoming structurally unfit for the use intended and a one-year limited warranty against rusting and workmanship of painted surfaces. Warranty is limited to winds of up to 90 mph when fabric canopies are installed (wind resistance improves 10 to 20 mph without canopies).

LIMITED WARRANTY ON SITE FURNISHINGS

GameTime provides a ten-year limited warranty on site furnishings against structural failure and a one-year limited warranty on powder coating. These warranties cover damage due to failure or corrosion of metal parts that cause the product to become structurally unfit for the intended use; see exclusions.

LIMITED WARRANTY ON FIBERGLASS SIGNAGE AND HDPE PANELS

This warranty does not cover damage resulting from ground settlement or high winds.

LIMITED WARRANTY ON FITNESS EQUIPMENT

GameTime provides a ten-year limited warranty on GTfit Advanced, Elite and stationary Base Series posts, welds, and bars and a five-year limited warranty on motion Base Series posts, welds, and bars against structural failure; a five-year limited warranty on Advanced Series stainless damper modules and aluminum cycle covers; a two-year limited warranty on Advanced and motion Base Series bearings, steel pins, dampers, plastics, rubber parts, cycle pedals and shafts, molded seats, backrests and clamps; and a one-year limited warranty on cycle rib belts and powder coating. These warranties cover damage due to failure or corrosion of metal parts that cause the product to become structurally unfit for the intended use; see exclusions.

GameTime provides a ten-year limited warranty on redwood and pressure-treated wood products against damage by decay or termites causing the wood to become structurally unfit for its intended use; see exclusions.

FIVE YEAR LIMITED WARRANTY ON GAMETIME SUPER SEAT™

GameTime provides a five-year limited warranty on Model No. 949 SuperSeat and Model No. 999 Super Seat-2 against structural failure that causes the seat to become unfit for its intended use; see exclusions. The factory installed "S"-Hook and Seat Hanger assemblies are covered under a one-year limited warranty against rust, corrosion or premature wear.

THREE-YEAR LIMITED WARRANTY ON RUBBER AND "C" SPRINGS FOR SADDLEMATES®





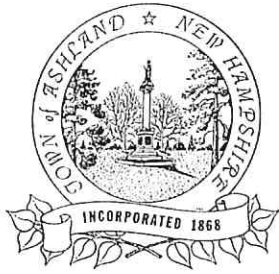

Subject: 2020 Dodge Charger Police Cruiser

Recommended motion: *to expend \$26,794.96 from the Ashland Police Car Capital Reserve Fund (CRF) for the purchase of a 2020 Dodge Charger Police Cruiser.*

Background: *Of the \$26,794 expenditure, a \$500 deposit will be released immediately and the remainder to be released upon delivery. This is an administrative vehicle. It will be unmarked, sans cage with minimal lighting to be utilized for training, administrative tasks and as the Chief's take home cruiser.*

Issue: *With new, proactive officers and the addition of another officer, the vehicles we currently have are getting more use than they were previously. To take the abuse off the patrol cruisers, this will allow the Police Department to have a more reliable rotation of vehicles and increase the longevity of the current cruisers on the road.*

Fiscal Impact: *Funds to be released for the Police CRF. CRF currently has \$32,590.39.*
