At the start of the meeting Selectman Cilley had connection issues and joined 15 16 after the board voted on the meeting minutes and interest abatement. 17 APPROVAL OF MINUTES 18 II. 19 20 **MOTION:** Selectman Newton 21 To approve the meeting minutes of April 20, 2020. 22 SECOND: Vice Chairman DeWolfe 23 **DISCUSSION:** Vice Chairman DeWolfe had two grammatical changes on page three. **VOTE:** 4 - 024 25 MOTION PASSED 26 III. 27 **NEW BUSINESS** 28 a. Ashland Water & Sewer i. Remove and inspect the pumping equipment at Well #2 – Superintendent 29 30 Cross provided the annual inspection report for wells number one and two. 31 Report was conducted by Weston & Sampson. The well performance at both 32 wells was lower than expected. As part of the inspection report Weston & 33 Sampson provided a proposal for \$17,830 to repair well number two. Scope of services from the proposal; pull the pump, test the motor, inspect, clean, flush 34 35 out, disinfect, and make repairs to get a better flow rate. Well number one had 36 a similar procedure a few years ago. Once the project is completed the well 37 should functionable for another ten years. Annual inspections on the electrical motor will continue. 38 39 40 b. Ashland Town Clerk/Tax Collector (TC/TX) 41 i. Unpaid Tax Bill Abatement – in the December 2019 property tax billing a payment (map 001-002-002-012C) was mistakenly returned to the mortgage 42 holder issuing a lien and interest in error. The bill was paid in the amount 43 44 \$1,881.13 with \$132.11 accruing interest. Tax Collector Tucker requested the

board abate the interest.

10	applications for the open appointed Deputy Town Clerk position. TC Tucker
11	recommended the board appoint applicant Jeanette Stewart. Board requested to
12	interview the applicant before voting on the appointment.

14	c. Ashland Police Department
15	i. Police Car Capital Reserve Fund (CRF) expenditure - Police Chief Ulwick
16	forwarded a proposal from Ossipee Mountain Electronics to expend \$7,999.98
17	from the Police Car CRF to upfit the new police cruiser. Installation of the parts
18	(lights, radar, siren, etc.) would take place in a couple of months as the parts are
19	not in stock and need to be ordered.
20	
21	MOTION: Selectman Newton
22	To release \$7,999.98 from the Police Car CRF for the upfitting of the new police
23	car.
24	SECOND: Vice Chairman DeWolfe
25	DISCUSSION: Selectman Lyford had issue with the car being a civilian
26	vehicle and not a standard police cruiser that has different car specifications.
27	Chief Ulwick concurred that the car was a basic package, not a front-line car
28	that would need those specifications. Selectman Lyford also had concerns with
29	the car being unmarked.
30	VOTE: 4 – 1

33	ii. Police Hazardous Pay – the Board decided not to extend the police hazardous
34	pay stipend at this time as earlier in the day, as part of the CARE Act, the
35	Governor issued hazard stipend pay to first responders.

37	d. Ashland Memorial Park Trustee reappointment – current member Stephen Jaquith
38	applied to be reappointed as a Memorial Park Trustee. Board thanked Stephen for his
39	prior service and voted his reappointment for a three-year term. Chairman Badger read
40	the oath of office after the appointment.
41	
42	MOTION: Vice Chairman DeWolfe
43	To appoint Stephen Jaquith for a three-year term as an Ashland Memorial Park Trustee.
44	SECOND: Selectman Newton

1 MOTION PASSED 2 e. Ashland 4th of July Committee – members of the committee were present to continue 3 the discussion with the board about holding the event this coming July. Committee 4 5 member Kendall Hughes asked the board to wait on deciding until June 1st, the next 6 expected announcement from the Governor about whether to remove the current stay at 7 home order. Board agreed to wait until June 1st. 8 9 Ashland Park & Recreation Campground - Park & Recreation Director Barney asked the Board to reopen the campground May 15th, prior to the June 1st date previously 10 11 voted upon by the board. (Earlier in the day the Governor relaxed the provisions about 12 campgrounds reopening during the pandemic). Director Barney proposed that if the 13 campground were to reopen earlier than expected, the bathhouse would remain closed. as would the beach, and there would not be access to the washer and dryers. If possible, 14 15 later this summer the beach, bathhouse, etc. would open. 16 17 MOTION: Selectman Newton To reopen the campground on May 15th under the conditions the bathhouse and other 18 19 amenities remain closed, and the building restrictions are to remain in effect. 20 SECOND: Vice Chairman DeWolfe 21 **VOTE:** 4-1 22 MOTION PASSED 23 IV. 24 SELECTBOARD ITEMS 25 a. Ashland Community Garden - Selectman Newton had a conference call with a few volunteers that wanted to keep the garden open with the expectations of reopening it to 26 27 the community. Those involved are going to create a plan on how to reopen and forward 28 it to the board. Gardeners requested the use of town water at the site, board did not take 29 exception to the request. Previous grant funding for the garden site are no longer 30 available, but tools for gardening or planting flowers are still available for volunteers. 31 Selectman Newton will continue to be the liaison for this group and asked the public if 32 they are interested in gardening to please contact the town office. Site has 20 plots 33 available. 34 35 MOTION: Vice Chairman DeWolfe 36 To allow a water supply at the community garden. 37 **SECOND:** Selectman Cilley **VOTE:** 4-0-138 39 MOTION PASSED 40 41 b. Annual review of town investment policy – per RSA 41: 9, VII the town should have 42 investment policy. The board reviewed the town's investment policy and did not 43 recommend any changes. 44 45 MOTION: Selectman Newton 46 To accept the town investment policy as written.
