Since our last report, the interest on the town debt has been reduced from four to three and one-half per cent., making a saving of more than $\$ 160.00$ per annum ; the Town Hall and Library Building have been reinsured for a term of three years, at a cost of $\$ 120.00$; the Town Hall repaired at a cost of about $\$ 200.00$; the school supplied with additional apparatus and books, at a cost of more than $\$ 560.00$, and the town debt reduced, aside from cost of soldiers' monument, $\$ 206.58$.

The sixth annual report shows the water works yet on the increase. The past year there was collected for water, nineteen hundred eleven dollars and fifty-seven cents $(\$ 1,911.57)$. Out of the amount collected, all bills have been paid, amounting to five hundred fifty-seven dollais and ninety cents (\$5.57.90), and the balance of the amount collected, one thousand three hundred sixty-three dollars and sixty-seven cents ( $\$ 1,363.67$ ), paid to the town treasurer.

The past year the bushes have been cut from reservoir to Jackson pond, the water in reservoir drawn out twice, and the reservoir cleared of all sticks, mud, lily pads, and filth of all kinds ; have opened the blow-off places in pipe several times during my term of office, and have tried to keep the water pure and wholesome. Thanking you all for your liberal patronage in the water business, I remain yours,

T'o the citizens of the town of Ashland:
In making this our annual report, we are glad to note that fires in our town have been few, and that the loss has been small. We have had only one fire where the damage was very much, and that was on March 31, when Mark S. Brown's building's were burmed, with a loss of about $\$ 1500.010$, and were insured for $\$ 600.00$. There was no alarm given.

On June 23 , there was an alarm pulled in from Box 59 , but there dras no fire to be found ; on August 28, there was a small fire in the woodshed connected with the Ashand Domestic Ba-
kery, which was put out with a few pails of water, and there was no damage ; on Dec. 16, there was an alarm from Box 64, when we were called to the house of D. P. Calley, which was nearly filled with smoke, coming then out of the upper windows, but we could find no fire, only the chimney burning out; on January 3, there was an alarm from Box 47, when we found a small fire in a tenement house occupied by Herman Lougee ; the damage was about $\$ 30.00$, to furniture, etc. : no insurance.

Our apparatus is in first class condition, and our firemen still keep up their well-earned reputation for doing prompt and efficient work. The fire alarm remains the same although an appropriation was voted at our last annual town meeting to make a change in it.

## Report of Board of Education.

REPORT OF BOARD OF EDUCATION, DIST. NO. 1.

This report covers the time from Aug 1, 1898, to Aug. 1, 1899. We have had 33. weeks of school, divided into two terms of 17 and 16 weeks. We mentioned in our last report that we were arranging a new system of classification, which we are pleased to say has been well received by pupils and parents. Pupils seem to take more interest in their studies, and aim to reach a higher standard.

During the winter, our schools were badly broken up by sickness, but our teachers were able to accomplish about the full amount of the year's work. Seven graduated from the ninth grade last June. The graduation last summer was a halcyon day for the participants, a pleasant remembrance for all concerned and an occasion worthy of emulation and repetition as the school years close.

Great improvements have been made in finishing off the two rooms in the upper part of the building, thereby relieving the congested condition of the schools, putting up a fire escape, concreting around the front of the building, and the addition of a large piece of ground in the rear, to be used as a playground.

The Higher Grammar was taught by Miss L. M. Bryant, with her usual success. Whole number of pupils, 36 ; average attendance, 31. The Lower Grammar was taught by Miss Ethyle Hawkins, with a fair degree of success. Whole number of pupils, 33; average attendance, 28 . 'The First Primary was taught by Miss Lillian J. Brown, who has been with us so long, that she needs no recommendation. Whole number of pupils, 43 ; average attendance, 33 . The Second Primary was taught by Miss Edith M. Bryant and Miss Alice P. Sargent, with quite good results, considering the irregular atteudance of míny of the pupils. Whole number of pupils, 71 ; average at-
tendance, 60 .
The teachers and some of the pupils are obliged to do much work in the school building nearly every night after school, and electric lights are needed; also a system of electric bells, to be used in case of fire, is needed in all the rooms.

We should have more weeks of school, in the interests of our children, which means more money. I also believe there should be another member added to the school board, whose duty shall be to have a general supervision of all our schools, and make out annual reports.
