WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ashland in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Ashland on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the town library.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial day.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the current expenses of the fire department for the ensuing year.

6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of the town debt, and to defray the interest thereon for the ensuing year.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the building and repairing of sidewalks for the ensuing year.

9. To see what arrangement the town will make towards paying for the new steel bridge over the Pemige-

wasset river, between the towns of Ashland and Bridgewater (Union Bridge so called), and raise and appropriate money for the same.

10. To see if the town will vote to put four or more electric lights on Collins street, between the depot and the leather board mill, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

11. To see if the town will vote to purchase a new heater for the Hose House, for the purpose of keeping the fire alarm chemicals from freezing, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

12. To see if the town will vote to re-wire the Town Hall and Town Building, to conform with the regulation of the New Hampshire Board of Underwriters, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

13. To see if the town will vote to fix up the basement of the Town Building to be used as a lobby, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

14. To see what action the town will take relative to the payment of the reward offered by the selectmen in 1905, "For the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who burglarized the dwelling house of Mrs. Lucy A. Dearborn," and raise and appropriate money for the same.

15. To see if the town will vote to accept the bequest of Ai Willoughby, late of Haverhill, N. H., deceased, of \$500.00 for the perpetual care of his burial lot in Green Grove cemetery.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise the license fee to the maximum fee of which class the license shall be granted.

REPORT OF FIRE WARDS.

To the Citizens of Ashland:

We, the Fire Wards of your town, are pleased to make our return for the year ending February 15, with so small an amount of danger done by fire and water.

The past year has been the banner year since we have had our water works. Our department has had only three calls during the entire year. Two of them were chimney fires with no damage, and one was at R. H. Spaulding's with a damage of about \$25.00, which was paid in full. The fire caught in the ell part of the house and by prompt action of Mrs. Spaulding, who used a small chemical, was extinguished before the Department arrived.

We have added to our equipment two 3-gallon chemical fire extinguishers, and six more fire alarm boxes. We know of no reason why our town is not well equipped for fighting all kinds of fires. The present year we think there should be added a few lengths of new hose, as some of it is getting old and liable to play out, after having been used ten years.

The supply in October was the lowest that has been since the water works were established twelve years ago, since that time it has been slowly gaining. The supply is controlled by 10-inch gate at pond, thus keeping reservoir full all the time.

The pond could be raised about two feet at an expense

of \$50.00 or less, and have a larger body of water to draw from in a dry time or the gate may be lowered and draw more than can be done at the present time. Two services have been dug up and replaced with new on account of filling with sediment which retarded the flow.
