

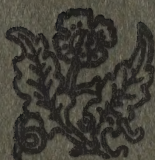

WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ashland in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town hall in said Ashland on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the town library.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial day.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the current expenses of the fire department for the ensuing year.

6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of the town debt and to defray the interest thereon for the ensuing year.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

8. To see if the town will vote to accept the provision of Section 1 of Chapter 211 of the Public Statutes of New Hampshire, relating to the establishment of a police court.

9. To see what action the town will take in order to provide a suitable compensation for the Justice of the Police Court in said town.

10. To see what action the town will take in order to provide some suitable place wherein the sessions of said Police Court can be held.

11. To see if the town will vote to put two more electric lights on River street and raise and appropriate money for the same.

12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to appoint policemen for the ensuing year and fix their compensation.

REPORT OF FIRE WARDS.

To the Selectmen and Citizens of the town of Ashland:

Again your fire wards have the pleasure of reporting a very small loss by fire. We were only called out three times during the year. The first call was on April 30, from box 66, for a brush fire back of the cemetery, and again on May 25, from box 59, for a slight fire at Deane & Peavey's portable sawmill near the depot, which was put out before the firemen got there, with no damage, and on Nov. 19, at 12:35 a. m., we were called from box 41 to a fire at the residence of Mrs. George F. Dow, caused by a defective chimney. The damage was \$74.83, which was paid in full. This fire was put out by the use of our chemical fire extinguisher, and that reminds us that we have used no water for any fires since March 18, 1906, at the store of Mrs. C. B. Tyrrell; everything has been handled with our chemicals, and we would recommend that in the near future the town should buy a 50-gallon chemical on wheels to be used on the first alarm.

We have added to our equipment 200 feet of new hose to take the place of some of our old hose that had been used in building the state road and was in such shape that it could not be repaired, and we have reorganized our hook and ladder company and have as good a one as any town needs, with Lauriston Goddard as foreman. Our equipment is in first class shape and can be used at any moment.

Hoping that we shall not be called upon to fight a fire for another year, we remain as ever your fire wards.

The water has been analyzed several times during the

year and reported very satisfactory for domestic purposes. The analysis shows a slight vegetable color but not to any injurious extent.

Since February first, there has been a fishy taste and odor, which is the same in the reservoir. This might be caused by the ice freezing over and not giving the water proper ventilation. Since that time the ice has been broken several times and the water drained out, and the supply seems to have improved during the past two weeks. Or again it might be caused by the fall of rains which occurred after the ground froze last fall and washed in from the banks of the pond and reservoir.

However, everything has been done by the town Board of Health and other to locate the trouble, and are willing to do anything to remove the cause.

There has been one more hydrant added during the year, making forty-eight public hydrants.

REPORT OF BOARD OF EDUCATION.

SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 1.

Since the last report the District has united with the School District of the Town of Holderness and the Meredith Town and Special Districts, in forming a Supervisory District for the purpose of employing a Superintendent. Mr. Samuel A. Burleigh of Vassleboro, Maine, was engaged at a salary of \$1,400. One half the salary is paid by the state and the other half is divided among the districts in proportion to the time given to each district, Ashland School District No. 1 being \$186.66 net. The arrangement is working very satisfactorily to date.

The district has purchased the balance of the "Keyes grove," so called, thus giving ample play-ground and doing away with a dispute over a boundry. The schools are now running harmoniously and good results are being shown throughout.
