## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the inhabitants of the Town of Ashland in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Ashland on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department.
4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the firemen and fire alarm system.
5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.
7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the District Nurse Association.
8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the expenses of the town poor.
9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the town debt.

11. To see if the Town will vote to buy a safe for the use of the Town Clerk in caring for the town records, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

12. To see if the Town will vote to make repairs to the Town Hall and raise and appropriate money for the same.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Memorial Hospital at Plymouth.

14. To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate to have the records looked up on all Land near and at the outlet of Little Squam Lake and be reported to the Citizens of the Town.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal, this twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

These estimated receipts may be used for unforeseen expenditures, exceeded appropriations, be applied to the payment of interest and the principal of the town debt, be applied to the amounts raised in town and school meetings.

The estimated appropriations for 1929 that follow may be raised at approximately a tax rate of \$2.70. For every thousand dollars change in the budget there will be a change of five cents in the tax rate, also each thousand dollars of the estimated receipts used to meet the appropriation will lower the rate approximately five cents.

During the school year 1927-1928 there were no schools maintained in Ashland Town School District. Eleven pupils attended the elementary grades in the Ashland Special School District, two attended the elementary grades in Plymouth Normal School, and two attended high school in the Special District.

At the annual meeting of the town district, March 1928, an article was placed in the warrant to see if the district would vote to petition the State Board of Education to take steps to unite the two school districts; after a consideration of the article the clerk of the town district, Mrs. O. H. Amsden, notified Commissioner E. W. Butterfield of the action and a hearing was arranged by the State Board of Education to be in Ashland at the Elementary School building at 10:00 o'clock A. M. May 10, 1928. At that hearing

the town was represented by the selectmen, the Special School District and the Town School District by their respective school boards and the State by Commissioner E. W. Butterfield, Deputy Commissioner, J. N. Pringle, Wilfrid J. Lessard of Manchester and Mrs. Alice S. Harriman of Laconia. The following agreement was drawn up:

An order Consolidating the Ashland Town School District and the Ashland Special School District.

That from the first day of July, 1928, the Ashland Town School District and the Ashland Special School District shall constitute a single school district to be known as the School District of the Town of Ashland and with the powers and duties of all districts established by the general school laws of the state; that the legally elected school board members in each district shall constitute the board for the united district until otherwise voted by said district; and the assessment for the support of schools of the combined district shall be the assessments as legally authorized by the separate districts on the ratable estate taxable in each.

It is furthermore provided that the school board of the united district, to prevent duplication, shall accept resignations of district officers and declare officers for the united district.

## SOME STATEMENTS ABOUT THE CURRENT SCHOOL YEAR, 1928-1929

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In July Harris W. Calley resigned from the office of treasurer of the Ashland Town School District; and O. A. Brown was appointed treasurer of the combined school district by the combined school board, after having resigned from the Ashland Special School Board. P. E. Gammons was elected chairman of the New Board. Much feeling of praise and appreciation should be expressed for the long and faithful service of Mr. O. A. Brown on the school board in Ashland. Mr. Brown served the school district efficiently and faithfully for a period of thirty consecutive years, during which time he worked for the welfare of the present and built well for the future. In the words of Mr. Brown, "I have, as school board member, seen the schools in Ashland evolve from an ungraded elementary school to the present system in two buildings having graded work and an approved high school course from which our pupils may go on to the State University and the State Normal Schools." The value of Mr. Brown's interest and efforts during all those years on the lives of all the children who have passed in and out of the Ashland schools can never be fully realized, but should be appreciated very greatly.

In March the entire school district was saddened by the death of the chairman of the school board, Mr. E. P. Colby. Mr. Colby had served the school district as a member of the board for fourteen consecutive years. All who worked with him were impressed by his abundant enthusiasm, his optimism, his progressiveness and never failing loyalty to all things that build for the welfare of the community and especially for the development of our boys and girls into well prepared and useful lives. His presence at school board meetings was always anticipated. And his ever readiness to devote his time and energy to school work made associations with him most pleasant, and inspired those left to carry on the work.

This year the Calley School is being maintained. There are nine pupils enrolled from Ashland and four from Holderness.



For repairs and improvements on the school buildings, the Pease school house roof has been recovered; the roof of the high school building has been recoated and the window sashes and the fire escapes have been repainted. Also wire re-enforced glass has been placed in the windows that open directly onto the fire escapes.

In the high school the Commercial Department has 37 pupils enrolled, the Domestic Arts Department has 23 enrolled, the College Preparatory Course has 2 enrolled.

There is no special teacher of music this year. Mr. Cotton and Miss Holland are handling the music work in the high school building and Mrs. Porter is supervising it in the elementary building. The schools will be giving the public programs of a musical nature later in the year. Mr. Cotton has organized a Junior Orchestra which is a very much worthwhile project and not only will the participants profit greatly by the experience but the public will greatly enjoy their playing. The elementary teachers and pupils have secured a piano for their building. The schools opened in September with an enrollment of 295 and has increased during the fall term to 310. There are 22 non-resident elementary pupils and 18 non-resident high school pupils.

In June, 1928, Helen M. Fleming, Herbert L. Noyes, Dorothy I. Dicklemier, Carroll C. Kelley and Margaret L. Fifield were graduated from the high school. Miss Fleming is continuing her education in Keene Normal School, Miss Fifield in Northfield Seminary and Mr. Noyes in Concord Business College.
