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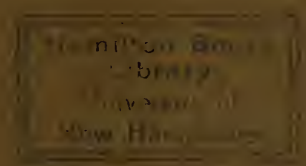

**ARTICLES FOR TOWN WARRANT, MARCH 1932**  
**March 8, 1932**

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1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department.
4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the firemen and the fire alarm system.
5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.
7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the District Nurse Association.
8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the expense of the town poor.

9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the Town Debt.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Emily Balch and Soldiers' and Sailors' Memorial Hospital at Plymouth, N. H.

12. To see if the town will vote to extend the town water to and including the houses beyond Ross Sanborn's near the New Hampton line.

13. To see if the Voters of the Town of Ashland will vote to elect the Uniform Police Officer at the Polls and not hire an out of town man. That he shall be the Tax Collector and Overseer of the Poor. The salary of said Officer shall not exceed Four Dollars and Fifty Cents per day. This article, if passed, to supersede Articles now on Town Records.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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These estimated receipts may be used for unforeseen expenditures, exceeded appropriations, be applied to the payment of interest and the principal of the town debt, and be applied to the amounts raised in town and school meetings.

By applying \$8,000.00 of the estimated receipts toward the different amounts raised in the town and school meetings, the balance of the following estimated appropriations may be raised by a tax rate of \$2.65. Every \$1,000.00 change in the budget and each \$1,000.00 of the estimated receipts used will change the tax rate approximately five cents.

## REPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT, YEAR 1931

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In submitting the following report for the Fire Department, for the year 1931, the busiest year in the history of the department, we would like to call your attention to several things.

In July, a 500 gallon Ahrens-Fox Triple Combination Fire Truck was put into service at a cost, including necessary bracing of the Fire Station floor, new doors, new hose and equipment, of \$7,037.43. It is the opinion of the Fire Wards that we have today, not only the best equipment we could buy with the money at our disposal, but that we have for the protection of the town, a piece of fire apparatus that will be of great value to the town for many years to come.

This year we were obliged to run new fire alarm wires down East Main Street as far as the property of Mrs. Georgiana Clark. The telephone and electric light companies put up new poles and new lines so we of necessity had to move and re-new our lines, altho it was an expense that we had not planned on.

During the year we were called to Holderness three times, Bridgewater twice and Plymouth once. The amounts received from each town for services of fire truck and men are shown below.

Our increase in number of chimney fires is alarming. Fortunately, our towns people are learning not to ring an alarm for chimney fires, but instead, send in a still alarm, which saves the expense of calling out the whole department. However, we, as Fire Wards, feel that some regulations should be made and enforced, not only in respect to the cleaning of chimneys, but also in regards to the elimination and cleaning up of other hazards and dangerous practises that we know exist. We feel, that in the near future, it would be advisable for the Fire Wards to draw up, publish and enforce, as they are empowered to do by the State Laws, a set of regulations pertaining to the inspection of, elimination

of, and cleaning up of risks, for the benefit and protection of all.

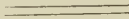

The difference between the appropriations called for and the estimated expenses for next year is \$3,187.06. We expect to make up this difference by receipts from tuitions, dog licenses, and George Reed Aid for the Home Economics department.

The equalized valuation upon which the five dollar tax for the support of elementary schools is based is \$2,230,587.00.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board, and Citizens of Ashland:

I have the honor to present my third annual school report.

There are many improvements which we should like to see in our school system. Considering the unusual conditions of the time we will not dwell on the things which we hope for. We do rejoice, however, that we have an elementary graded school system with one teacher to a grade, all of them experienced and normal school graduates. We also rejoice in that we have a high school which offers the following curriculums: College Preparatory, Home Economics, Commercial, and a general course, with electives in every curriculum to cater to the individual needs of the majority of our pupils. Ashland in many respects has a greater educational spread than most towns its size.

### The Calley School.

It is difficult to suggest a policy for the improvement of the Calley school. It is hard to forecast either growth or loss of population for rural communities at the present time. As a matter of good business no large sums of money should be spent on that building. However, a few minor repairs to the wood shed and the toilets should be made. For less than fifty dollars we have had electric lights installed. The building is now more valuable both as a community center and a school house. In time we shall see our way clearer as to whether or not it is worth while to maintain a school in that part of the town.

### The Teaching Staffs.

Two changes occurred in the elementary school staff this year. The first grade position was filled by a teacher with several years of experience. For the fifth grade we were able to secure a teacher with three years of post secondary training, instead of the usual



two. Two of last year's high school teachers went to better positions in Massachusetts and New York state. A change also occurred in the Home Economics department. The three positions were filled with desirable teachers. Two high school teachers attended summer school for self improvement. Taken as a group our teachers compare favorably with the staffs of other towns.

### **Education.**

It is true that an education should contribute towards enabling boys and girls to make a living. Yet an education will fail to educate in the true significance of the word, if all it emphasizes is vocation. Broadly speaking secondary education, the most advanced form Ashland provides, should stress a curriculum which includes the serious study for a period of three or four years, of some subject for vocational purposes, supplemented by other studies for terms of shorter duration, emphasizing cultural values, which prepare individuals for the institutions of life.

### **Advice to Parents and Pupils**

In the Ashland high school we stress promotion by subject instead of by the year. This means that failure in one or two subjects will not force the pupil to repeat a whole year. We require the taking of sixteen courses for graduation from high school. The ordinary pupil can complete four courses in one year. It sometime happens that four units of study proves too much for certain individuals. We permit such pupils to take only three units a year, and do the work required to graduate in five years. This plan makes it possible for such pupils to do the work at a rate more in accord with their ability, secure an education, and not fall by the wayside. Parents who have the best interests of their children at heart will encourage them to comply with this plan. Speed should not be emphasized at the expense of the goal. It is better to succeed in five years, than to fail in four, or to give up the first year.

## Elementary School Items

Last June diplomas showing completion of the elementary school course were awarded by vote of the school board to the pupils of the eighth grade. The pupils of the sixth grade received certificates of promotion to the junior high school. This was a new procedure in our school administration.

There were a few pupils in the sixth and in the eighth grades whose work was not satisfactory. Those pupils were put ahead on condition that they make good in the upper grade after a trial of six weeks. All but one made good in the seventh grade, and all but one made good in the ninth grade.

Closing exercises were held to mark the end of the school year in the elementary school building. This, too, was a new event. An interesting program was presented in the town hall.

All the features described in this section met with approval. We are, therefore, in hopes to continue the precedents then established, at the end of the present school year.

## High School Graduation

Eighteen young men and women were awarded high school diplomas last June. That was the largest class which has ever been graduated from the high school. The class day program, the organization of an alumni association, and the reception to the graduating class, all of them new events, added to the interest and beauty of graduation week.

## High School Athletics

Athletics is generally recognized as a legitimate school activity. Personally, I do not believe that it is any great calamity for a coach, a team, or a school to lose athletic contests. I do believe that, that school best serves the interests of youth and society in general which gives every child in the school system an opportunity to engage both in indoor and outdoor activities sufficient to promote normal growth and health. It is a scientific fact recognized as far back as the

Greeks and the Romans that a healthy body fosters a healthy mind. I also believe that sufficient opportunity exists for worthwhile athletic contests among the children of a school itself.

One of the great evils of educational institutions today is the overtraining of a small group of boys and girls, and of young men and women, to win athletic contests, which are interpreted as honor and glory to the winner, and humiliation and defeat to the loser. Fortunately this is not the belief of great American educators and philosophers.

### **We Have Practiced Economy**

It has been our aim to give the children of Ashland as good educational advantages as possible for the means available. Without curtailing on necessities we have used school supplies economically. No books have been discarded in order to introduce a new set. Our greatest expense in this respect has been to replace wornout material. We have been economical in the use of janitor's supplies, fuel, and the purchase of athletic goods. Our attraction of tuition pupils from other towns has resulted in the receipt of substantial sums of money for the use of the school district. Last year over two hundred dollars was received from the federal government to help us defray our expenses for running the Home Economics department. A substantial sum is expected from the same source this year. This is made possible by the fact that we are able to maintain the high standards required by the George Reed Act. We have encouraged our boys and girls to pay for their own supplies in connection with the work in Home Economics, and Manual Training. No milk or free lunches have been served to needy children at the expense of the school district. Help has been received for this purpose chiefly from the Women's American Legion Auxiliary. All these facts show conclusively that the tax rate for educational purposes in Ashland has been kept as low as possible.

### **In Conclusion**

I have kept in close contact with the boys and girls, the teaching staffs and principals, the school board, and in a general way with the public. With the continued interest and desire to grow on the part of the community as a whole, our hope for a continuous improvement of an educational opportunity which will provide for the individual and collective needs of every child will be satisfied.
