ARTICLES FOR TOWN WARRANT, MARCH 1933 MARCH 14, 1933

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department.

4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the firemen and the fire alarm system.

5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.

7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the District Nurse Association.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the expense of the Town Poor.

9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the Town Debt.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Emily Balch and Soldiers' and Sailors' Memorial Hospital at Plymouth, N. H.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes if necessary.

13. To see if the Town will vote to extend the sidewalk on Washington Street to the garage of Archie Bellevance and raise and appropriate money for the same.

14. To see if the Town will vote to widen the highways known as Gordon and School Streets at and near the dwelling house now occupied by Henry Logan and raise and appropriate money for the same.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The equalized valuation upon which is based the five dollar tax for the support of elementary schools is \$2,137,587.00, which is \$93,476.00 less than it has been for the last two years.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and the Citizens of Ashland:

I have the honor to present my fourth annual school report. Last September our schools opened with an enrollment of two hundred sixteen pupils in the grades, and ninety in the high school. These figures have remained more or less constant through the year. In the figures mentioned are included seven elementary school pupils from New Hampton, and twenty High school pupils from New Hampton, Holderness, Bridgewater, Wentworth, and Sanbornton. Notwithstanding the fact that Ashland has taken in about three thousand dollars a year in the form of tuition, the cost of our schools is a substantial one. When we consider that we are educating children for complex modern life, can we afford to do less for them? A guest who had been invited to supper helped himself to butter in generous amounts. The hostess turned to the guest and called his attention to the high cost of butter. The guest replied that he was aware of the fact, and smacking his lips added, "it's worth it."

Economy has been practiced in every department of our schools. It is due to this that we have been able to furnish supplies and equipment for our Domestic Arts, the Commercial department, the Physics and the Chemistry laboratories, and for Manual training in the Junior High School, without asking for special appropriations. It is also due to the fact that we closed the last school year with a balance of eleven hundred dollars that we have been able this year to make very much needed improvements to the lavatories in the two buildings, the ceiling of various parts of the high school building, the enlargement of the manual training room, repairs to the roof of the high school, and improvements in the Domestic Arts laboratory.

It has been seen fit to discontinue the Calley School at North Ashland. By the addition of ten dollars a week to the previous cost of transportation from that section of the town, we have saved the expense of supporting a third school, and one teacher's salary. The only loss is about two-hundred fifty dollars from tuition pupils. Notwithstanding this loss we have effected a saving of over five hundred dollars a year. The people living in homes located on a highway which is passable the year round, with daily bus service for school children, who get home before 4:30 P. M., every day, and enjoy the advantages of a consolidated school, have no reason to feel discriminated against in their civic rights.

Our school membership has been growing constantly. This is particularly noticeable in the high school. This is mainly due to the fact that we are succeeding in fitting the school to the children, rather than the children to the school.

During the past year the usual school activities have taken place. The new precedents established of late years, all of which have been previously reported, have been kept up.

I report gratifying results in athletics. This not only because we have won more victories, but because the introduction of track athletics has encouraged more boys and girls to take part in physical activities. I hope to see the day when every boy and every girl in the schools will be provided with at least one daily period for vigorous health activities.

During this period of economic reconstruction I advocate no additions to our present educational program. Yet I wish to emphasize that we should do nothing which will lessen educational opportunity in Ashland. Yet it is not beyond our means to improve the appearance of our school grounds. I also believe that gradually we can afford to equip our class rooms with more modern desks and seats. It is also well to keep in mind the improvements of the sanitary facilities in the elementary school building, and of the heating system.

One of the greatest drawbacks to a school is the child who is absent from school unneccessarily, or for slight cause. Such children take up the time of the teachers and that of other pupils when the regular work has already been done. The school with many absences establishes a poor record. In the end it is the child who must pay the penalty, and experience a belated sense of regret for lost opportunity. The teachers, and the parents in particular hold the solution in their hands. Unselfish cooperation on the part of everyone concerned is ever a present need.

The bulk of my work as executive for the state and the local school boards consists in providing the proper materials for the schools to work with, in co-operating with my associates, and in furnishing a certain amount of leadership and stimulation for a better understanding and a greater conception of a very difficult occupation, namely, the education of all the children of all the people.
