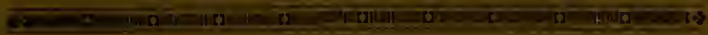

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
ARTICLES FOR TOWN WARRANT

MARCH 12, 1935

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the Firemen and the expenses of the Fire Alarm System.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for state aid construction.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.

8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Emily Balch Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hospital.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Laconia Hospital Association.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nurse Association.

12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, if necessary.

14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collectors deeds.

15. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

16. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for extending the water main to New Hampton Line near the Town Dump.

17. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the extension of the sidewalk from the Archie Bellevance house to the house owned by Mrs. Sadie Morse on Washington street.

18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to exempt or rebate any taxes assessed on any hotel property, which may be erected in the town of Ashland, for a period of five years.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The following is a report of the activities carried on in your town by the State Board of Health, Division Maternity, Infancy and Child Hygiene, in cooperation with the local district nursing association and a committee representing other societies of the town, for the year of 1934.

May 4, 1934 Child Health Conference—35 children were given physical examinations by Dr. L. M. Orton and Dr. L. A. Middleton.

60 defects were found.

16 defects had been corrected since last conference.

3 other defects had been under treatment.

Seven weighing and measuring conferences have been held. These were held the first Friday afternoon in the month. Babies and pre-schools were weighed and measured and advice given on diet and care by the nurse in charge. There was a total attendance of 64 at these conferences.

August 27, 1934—A dental hygienist was present at the conference. Thirteen pre-school children had teeth cleaned, and the mothers were instructed in regard to the proper care of children's teeth and diet in regard to teeth.

December 7, 1934—A diphtheria toxoid clinic for protection against diphtheria was held.

A total of 66 children were immunized; babies, 6 months to one year, 5; 1-6 years, 43; 6-9 years 18.

Under the Child Recovery program the following defects have been corrected:

Tonsil and adenoid operations 7.

At a Dental Clinic with Dr. G. A. Danforth, from Manchester, the following defects were corrected:

Cleaning 1; Extractions, 2; Fillings, 21.

The refinancing of the town debt is an important step forward in the history of our town.

Outside of the Bond Issue the town of Ashland is indebted to no one. There is no outstanding obligation either to banks or others, every bill is paid.

The requirements of the Bond Issue make it imperative that—ASHLAND MUST NOW GET OUT OF DEBT.

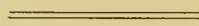

Our School Buildings and Equipment

At the present time, our entire school population is cared for in the two buildings in the village, all pupils from outlying sections being transported. Of these two buildings, the older one, used for Grades 1 to 6, provides adequate room for all these grades. Toilet facilities here, however, are unfit for use, as the basement on the boys' side is dark, cold, and not properly ventilated. The high school building, in which are housed Grades 7 to 12, is more crowded. The desks and chairs in this building are in very poor condition and should soon be replaced. The roof of this building has been repaired during the present year, but water which leaked through it last year has discolored ceilings and walls, and caused some plaster to fall.

Music Supervision

A commendable beginning has been made, during the past year, in introducing our pupils to the elements of note reading in music. This year our effort has been to carry this work into the junior high school, (grades 7 and 8), also to develop interest in music study and participation on the part of senior high school students. In addition to the orchestra formed previously, a beginners' class on orchestra instruments has been started this year. Much credit is due to Mrs. Adams for her efforts in directing the music teaching in our schools.

Health and Physical Welfare

Success in study or school work of any type is dependent upon good nourishment and good health. Our school physician and nurse make an annual inspection of the physical condition of each pupil. Where defective eyes, ears, teeth, etc., are found, corrections are recommended; and in many cases such defects are remedied. A hot dish at noon during the winter months is provided by the home economics department at a cost of 3 cents per pupil. The cooperation which parents and others have given us in our health program is much appreciated.

The report of the school nurse includes the following items:

Teaching the Fundamentals

Whatever other worth while activities the schools may encourage or develop in our children, we must never lose sight of those old-fashioned necessities, reading, writing, arithmetic, spelling and English. To aid in directing instruction in these branches, standardized tests are being given from time to time to determine the standing of each class and individual as compared with others in the same grade elsewhere. These tests have another valuable function—to determine the points of weakness in each pupil's preparation, and thus to guide the teachers in providing drill where most needed.

Our High School

The teaching staff and equipment of Ashland High School compare very favorably with those in other towns of New Hampshire. One new teacher—Miss Laura Stocker of Sunapee, has replaced Miss Grover as teacher of English and French.

The demand for Latin in our high school has steadily declined, until at the present time only one pupil in Ashland is studying this subject. Because there is so little demand, the school board has voted not to offer more than two years of work in Latin hereafter, instead of four. This shorter course meets the entrance requirements of colleges generally.

Students attending our high school have the opportunity of choosing studies which fall into three groups or courses of study, as follows:

- (a) General or college preparatory course.
- (b) Home economics course.
- (c) Commercial course.

This arrangement offers ample opportunity to girls to choose either academic or useful courses; but we are not doing as well by our boys. There is need for a course in shop work for those boys who are not academically inclined.

Changes in Supervisory Unions

In 1933, the State Legislature, by cutting the appropriation for state-wide supervision of schools, made necessary a decrease in the number of superintendents employed, and a rearrangement of the school districts in various unions in such a way as to increase the number of teachers under each superintendent. Ashland is now included with four other districts—Meredith, Center Harbor, Holderness and New Hampton.

Recommendations for 1935-1936

(a) The toilet facilities for boys at the elementary school should be improved without delay. Several plans for rearranging their location and providing proper ventilation have been considered by the school board and superintendent, and we find that the cheapest satisfactory plan will cost about \$700.00.

(b) We should make a beginning in the purchase of new desks for the high school. I suggest that we equip one small room this year, and purchase a portable sanding machine to smooth the tops of old desks remaining in use. The cost this year should not exceed \$400.00.

(c) The need of plastering and refinishing the classroom walls and ceilings at the high school has already been mentioned. In view of other proposed expenditures this year, I would advise against doing more than patching the loose places in the plaster at this time. Enough should be available from our present repair appropriation to pay for doing this.
