STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
ARTICLES FOR TOWN WARRANT

March 10, 1936

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the Firemen and the expenses of the Fire Alarm System.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for state aid construction.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the town library.

8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Emily Balch Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hospital.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Laconia Hospital Association.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nurse Association.

12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, if necessary.

14. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget act on petition of 10 property tax payers.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for band concerts and make appropriation for the same.

16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the lakes region.

17. To see if the town will vote to abolish the position of Road Agent as an elective office, and that the Road Agent shall be appointed by the Board of Selectmen; on petition of 10 property tax payers.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Ashland:

This, my second annual report, deals with the following subjects:

- (a) Statistics of our schools.
- (b) Our school buildings and equipment.
- (c) Comparative school costs.
- (d) Activities in our high school.
- (e) Health and physical welfare.
- (f) Alcohol and safety education.
- (g) Current problems and education.

Statistics of Our Schools

Table A, on an adjacent page, shows that Ashland's record of attendance compares very favorably with the average of the state. The small number of tardinesses in all of the first six grades is especially commendable.

Our School Buildings and Equipment

Two important improvements on our elementary school building should be noted: the new toilet room, and the painting of the fire escape.

In accordance with the vote of the last school meeting, the unsatisfactory toilet conditions which characterized the old boys' basement have been remedied. A space on the first floor, located between the first and second grade classrooms, and formerly used as a store room and for ventilating flues, was made over into a toilet room. With adequate window lighting, an air outlet flue for ventilation, and a waterproof floor of mastic composition, the new room is entirely satisfactory, and removes all of the objectionable features which existed in the old basement room.

The painting of the fire escape and playground equipment was done as a WPA project in November. The workmen also painted most of the exposed metal surfaces such as porch roofs, flashing around windows,

etc., all that could be reached without building a staging. All of this work was very timely as the exposed surfaces of the metal were beginning to rust in places. The contribution of the WPA represented a helpful saving to Ashland taxpayers.

The painting of all wood surfaces, including window frames, porches, doors, etc., on the elementary school building, should be attended to during the present summer. The top of the chimney also needs to be rebuilt, from the roof up, as it is cracked. The cost of all this work is estimated at \$600.00, and is included as one of the items in the school board's budget.

A number of new chairs have been purchased for the high school. More should be provided next year, as practically all of the furniture there is badly worn or in very poor condition. The allowance of \$400.00 is suggested as adequate to purchase enough seats for one classroom, and a sanding machine to smooth the tops of old desks that must still be used.

Comparative Schools Costs

Ashland's tax rate showed a marked increase last year. Part of this was due to increases in school expenses, as explained at last year's meeting. Naturally, the question has been raised as to how Ashland's school costs compare with those in other towns of similar size and situation. To help answer this question, I referred to State Board of Education reports, and chose for comparison all the school districts in New Hampshire of approximately the same size as Ashland. Comparative figures from these districts appear in the tables below.

Table B shows the costs per pupil of elementary schools, from nineteen districts having an enrollment of from 190 to 230 pupils. (Ashland's elementary enrollment was 216.)

Activities in Our High School

In any high school, in addition to the maintenance of high standards of work in various classes, the teachers are responsible for adequate direction of various social and athletic activities. Our teaching staff, under Headmaster Gunn's leadership, have instituted a plan of coordinating these activities in Ashland High School in a very effective way.

The various organizations, including basketball and baseball teams, game club, music club, outing club, etc., come under the jurisdiction of the Activities Association. This association is composed of all the pupils in high school who pay dues of ten cents per month. This year about 90% of the pupils are members. The governing body is composed of a representative from each class and from each activity. This body, the Board of Control, has direct control of all activities and finances, and is responsible for the organization and direction of monthly assemblies. The association is solvent.

Much interest has been built up in the Outing Club, and plans are in hand for making it an "all-seasons" activity. It is hoped to make possible a winter sports team next winter which can compete with teams from other schools.

The object of these activities, which are purely social, is to interest pupils in doing those things well which they are bound to do when they leave school. We have found that in social activities there is desirable development of morale or school spirit, as well as a sense of cooperation among the pupils themselves and with the teaching staff.

Health and Physical Welfare

One outstanding accomplishment in this field during the past year was the holding of a dental clinic for the benefit of school pupils.

The nurse's report shows the following number of corrections of physical defects since the last report:

Alcohol and Safety Education

Instruction concerning the effects of alcohol and other narcotics upon the human system is required by law. Recently a new bulletin for teachers, with suggestions for appropriate methods of instruction, has been issued by the State Board of Education. The need for thorough and effective instruction on this topic has become more evident during the past few years.

Frequent accidents to children on the highways everywhere make necessary special attention to safety instruction, emphasizing ways of avoiding danger from automobile traffic.

Current Problems and Education

In these days history is being made rapidly, and our leaders are attempting to solve great problems such as are caused by poverty, unemployment, taxation, war threats, and many other factors. It is necessary that our boys and girls understand something of what is going on today, as well as the history of years gone by. The inexpensive weekly newspapers, printed in language the children can read, is an important help toward greater understanding of today's important developments. Our course in social science, combining the work of geography, history and civics for grades seven and eight, also is planned and taught with the fundamental purpose of getting a better understanding of the various factors that have contributed to our complex civilization.

Conclusion

The superintendent and teaching staff are always ready to help parents with problems involving the education and welfare of the children in our schools. A sympathetic understanding is the best basis for success in working together to build good character as

well as good scholarship. We always welcome opportunities to talk with parents in the effort to arrive at such an understanding.

I wish here to express my personal thanks for the fine cooperation during the past year, of the school board, teachers, and citizens of Ashland.
