ARTICLES FOR TOWN WARRANT  
STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

March 9, 1937

---

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the Firemen and the expenses of the Fire Alarm System.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.

8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Support of the Poor.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Emily Balch Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hospital.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nurse Association.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, if necessary.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the lakes region.

14. To see if the town will vote to instruct Selectmen to light and Flood the Skating Rink on School Grounds.

15. To see what action the town will take in regard to the purchase of an Additional Truck Plow.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for repairs of sidewalks.

17. To see if the town will vote to accept the bequest of house, land and trust funds, as provided in the Will of the late Emma H. Scribner.

18. To vote on the following question:—Is it expedient to call a Convention to revise the Constitution?

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

To the Citizens of Ashland:

This, my third annual report, deals with the following subjects:

- (a) Decreased school costs.
- (b) Our school buildings and equipment.
- (c) Changes in our teaching staff.
- (d) Acknowledgments.

### Decreased Costs

Through savings in various items of school expenditures, it has been possible to make a considerable decrease in the present year's cost, also a decrease of approximately 10% in the budget for 1937-1938. These savings to the taxpayers have been made possible by using soft coal instead of the more costly anthracite, by a decrease in the janitor's salary, by having paid in full last year the balance of the district debt and interest, and by economizing on various minor items.

### School Buildings and Equipment

Since the very satisfactory job of painting the elementary school fire escape as a WPA project last year, an application was made early last summer for approval of another project involving further painting and repairs that are much needed on the building and the grounds. This project was approved late in the fall, but men were not available from the state quota of WPA workers until winter had set in, so the matter was postponed until more favorable weather conditions should make it possible to accomplish satisfactory results. We are hoping that the job may be begun early in the spring.

Instead of spending our total equipment allowance for new desks, we have sanded and refinished the tops of about 150 desks that were still substantial but badly scratched and marred. The writing surface was

thereby made as good as new, giving us the benefit of several years more wear from furniture that seemed destined for the junk pile.

The interior of both buildings needs refinishing badly. The high school especially requires attention, as the plaster has not been repaired since it was damaged by water from a leaky roof several years ago.

The furnace in the elementary building was moved to another part of the basement, in order to connect with a larger chimney and secure a more satisfactory draft. The change has proved to be a great improvement, as it not only increases the efficiency of our heating plant, but it also enables us to burn soft coal at a saving of several hundred dollars each year. By securing an oil treated coal, we have eliminated the objectionable dust that has been such a nuisance with ordinary soft coal.

### Changes in Teaching Staff

Last December, Miss Viola Harding, our sixth grade teacher, resigned to accept a position in Massachusetts. Her place was temporarily filled by Dorothy Fussell, and this fall Frances Carroll was transferred from the fifth grade to the sixth, her place being filled by Bernice Carleton of Lisbon.

On November first, Mrs. Alice Schriber who has been the head of our commercial department for several years, resigned to accept a similar position in Claremont High School. We secured in her place F. Olga Williams, of Lawrence, Massachusetts, there being no available candidates in New Hampshire at that time.

Our second grade is being taught this year by Dorothy Tierney as substitute for Miss Blanche Rogers, who has been unable because of poor health to resume her duties this year.

It seems fitting to make some expressions here of our appreciation of Miss Rogers' long and faithful service in our school system as one of our most successful primary teachers. Many of the graduates of

our schools, as well as the boys and girls now enrolled in all grades from the third upward, remember with gratitude her sympathetic, thorough, and untiring efforts to help them learn. Her fame rests not upon books she might have written nor upon marble statues she might have carved, but upon the minds and hearts of children where life's fundamental lessons were skilfully engraved through the quiet courage and unfailing patience of her personality.

#### Acknowledgments

Special thanks are due to the Civic Club for providing a skating rink on the playground back of the school.

No detailed mention has been made in this report of the main everyday task of all teachers—the job of building a better citizenship for the next generation. The commonplace task, well done, is worthy of the highest praise. The teachers deserve our sincere commendation for their faithful efforts, as well as the parents and school board for their willing cooperation.
