

ARTICLES FOR TOWN WARRANT STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

March 8, 1938

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the firemen and the expenses of the Fire Alarm System.
- 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to move the Town Library to the Scribner Memorial Building and raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for this purpose.
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Poor.
- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Emily Balch Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hospital.
- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nurse Association.
- 11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, if necessary.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to build and maintain a skating rink.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for repairs of Sidewalks.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to purchase chairs for Town Hall.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Janitor for the Town Hall, instead of electing by ballot.
- 18. To see what action the Town will take in regard to real estate taken over by the town for non-payment of taxes.
- 19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell or rent the Hemphill property on Hill St., recently acquired.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Road Agent to employ some needy citizen of the town to keep the Main St., clean during the summer months and charge the same to the Road Department.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars for the purpose of shingling one side of the roof of the Town Hall and paint the town building and install a different heating system in that building.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$211.00 to pay the town's share of the expenses of repairs to Town Clock Tower.
- 23. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Police Officers and Overseer of the Poor, and fix their salary.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

It seems appropriate that at the end of the first year of the Budget Committee's existence in Ashland that the following part of Chapter 9, Section 5, Laws of New Hampshire - 1935, under which this Committee was chosen, should be called to the attention of all spending agencies in the town:

"5. EXCEEDING APPROPRIATIONS. In towns adopting the provisions of this act, no board of selectmen, school board or other spending agency shall pay or agree to pay any money or incur any liability involving the expenditure of money for any purpose for which an appropriation has not been made, or in excess of any appropriation or allotment made to it except for the purpose of paying judgments rendered against a town or school district, provided, however, that in case of sudden and unexpected emergency the selectmen may on application to the tax commission and the school board on application to the state board of education after hearing be given a certificate of emergency authorizing them to make such expenditure or incur such liability;......"

We wish to call attention to the fact that figured upon the present valuation of this town, each one thousand dollars change in the amount raised by property taxes makes an approximate difference of seven cents in the tax rate. To the Citizens and Voters of Ashland:

Realizing that the problem of taxes is everywhere a serious matter, your committee has made an earnest effort to compile a budget that will meet the reasonable requirements of all necessary town departments and activities, for the coming year and at the same time will not impose an unreasonable burden on the average taxpayer.

We would recommend raising \$500.00 each year for the present to carry on the work of repairing sidewalks.

The \$1,000.00 for the repairs to town buildings is urgently needed, and should be raised.

It would appear to be best to accept State Aid for the further improvement of our Class V, dirt roads, as the state contributes four dollars to the town one dollar for this work, this, if voted, will give the town \$6,416.13 highway money in all, for the coming year. A portion of this should be used to oil the gravel road built last year at North Ashland.





REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

In this, my fourth annual report, the following subjects are briefly discussed:

- (a) Changes in supervisory unions
- (b) School buildings and grounds
- (c) Changes in teaching staff
- (d) Our high school
- (e) Acknowledgments

Changes in Supervisory Unions

Because of a reduction in the appropriation for salaries of school superintendents made by the legislature at its last session, the State Board of Education has again been required to regroup some of the districts of the state into larger unions. This union now consists of the following six districts, with the number of teachers and pupils in each as indicated. (Part time teachers and music supervisors are not counted.)

Our School Buildings

By eliminating or postponing repairs on our school buildings for the past two years, the school board was able to accumulate a sum sufficient to do a thorough job of repairing and refinishing the plastered surfaces of walls in both buildings during the past summer. The asphalt sidewalks and areas adjoining the buildings had been damaged by washouts and long usage and needed to be resurfaced. Part of the slate blackboards in the elementary building were so gray with use that they did not show chalk marks distinctly; these were sanded so they are now practically as good as new. The re-

mainder of the old desks in use by junior and senior high school pupils have been sanded and varnished.

The exterior woodwork on the elementary building, including doors, porches, window frames, and steep sides of mansard roof, have needed painting for a long time. This work was accepted by WPA authorities a year ago last November as a project, the labor cost to be borne by the WPA. As painting could not be done in freezing weather, the project was postponed until the spring of 1937, and finally dropped from their list on account of lack of funds. I believe we should not wait longer for assistance from this source, for the job should be completed this summer.

Changes in Teaching Staff

In the elementary building, Mrs. Muriel Gale Glode has been replaced as first grade teacher by Helen Guyotte.

Four of the six high school teachers are new this year. Elizabeth Scribner is taking the place of Mrs. Alice Simonds, who is having a year's leave of absence at her request. Misses Alta Alexander, Laura Stocker and Olga Williams resigned, and have been replaced by Charlotte Redden as teacher of home economics, Mary Walsh in the commercial department, and Arline Hayes as teacher of Latin, biology, and social science.

Our High School

A school is a miniature community. It has its work, its pleasure, its problems—social and disciplinary—quite similar to those found in the community where it is located. Recognizing this principle, the headmaster and his assistants on the teaching staff have been working for five years on a plan for building a school community in which every member may be a loyal and helpful citizen. This plan centers about a program of activities which present such a variety of interests that everyone can find something that will appeal to him as worth while.

This year's activities include athletics, an outing club, an art club, a school magazine, a dance club, a science club, a glee club and orchestra, TNT, and a few

Each of these activities is supervised by the member of the teaching staff best qualified to do so. In athletics, basketball for boys and girls, baseball for boys, and the outing club, one finds the benefits of vigorous physical activity, of teamwork, and of compe-In the art club, a pupil tition with other schools. learns about the application of art to handicraft, and has an opportunity to develop his own skill in these respects. In the science club, a definite effort is made to go further into the subject than is done in regular class work, and this appeals to those especially interested in science. The school magazine, "The Beehive," has been revived this year and one issue printed; judging from its reception, it has been a decided success. The TNT, a club of a limited number of girls, is the service organization of the school. The members stand ready at all times to assist with programs, to usher, to care for refreshments-in short, to do all that is necessary to make the event a success.

Those pupils who are interested in music have an opportunity to join the glee club or the orchestra, or both. In April, this year, Ashland's orchestra joins with others from high schools in this region in the Pemigewasset Valley Festival held at New Hampton. We expect also to be represented at the All-State Festival in Nashua in May. The Glee Club plans to present an operetta, "Paints and Patches," the proceeds of which will help meet the expenses of baseball.

In order to coordinate and keep a proper balance between these numerous activities, the entire program (with the exception of the orchestra and glee club) is under the jurisdiction of the Board of Control, made up of representatives from each class and from each school activity. This Board of Control plans programs for parties and assemblies, also calendars of events in order to prevent conflicts or over-emphasis at the expense of regular studies. Management of such affairs provides actual experience in democracy without turning over the discipline of the entire school to the students, as is sometimes done in experiments at student government. However, out of this five-year program under the Board of Control, there has evolved among the pupils and between pupils and teachers a spirit of

cooperation and mutual respect which is so conspicuous that Mr. Russell Leavitt, the High School Agent of the State Board of Education, said at the time of his last visit of inspection that the discipline of the school is the best that he had seen here in years.

Turning from the topic of school activities to a discussion of the curriculum offered to Ashland boys and girls, an analysis of the subjects presented for their choice reveals that we are providing very good vocational as well as cultural opportunities for girls, but a decided lack of vocational training for boys. The courses offered fall into three groups, as follows:

Curriculum I—General curriculum (including college preparatory subjects)

Curriculum II—Home economics curriculum.
Curriculum III—Commercial curriculum.

Practically all of the boys are enrolled in Curriculum I. A course in shop work would be a desirable addition to our present courses of study. All large high schools in the state, and nearly a score of the smaller schools, now provide instruction in shop work beyond the eighth grade. Such a proposal for Ashland has been seriously considered by the school board, but action upon it is postponed until some future time at the request of the budget committee.

Acknowledgments

Special thanks is due the Woman's Club, the District Nursing Association, and the Red Cross for assisting in fitting pupils with much needed glasses, and in providing cod liver oil and orange juice during the winter months. Those who have kept the skating rink in condition have also performed a real service to our children.

The loyal and effective work of the teachers and the friendly cooperation of school board, parents, and others are much appreciated.
