ARTICLES FOR TOWN WARRANT STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE March 12, 1940

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ashland in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Ashland on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the firemen and the expenses of the Fire Alarm System.
- 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Poor.
 - 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Emily Balch Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hospital.

- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Nurse Association.
- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, if necessary.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$154.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to maintain a Skating Rink.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for repairs of Sidewalks.
- 15. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department.
- 16. To see what action the Town will take regarding the purchase of snow removal equipment.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue printing the Vital Statistics in the Town Report.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to have the inventory printed in the Town Report once in every three years.
- 19. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Flag Appropriation of \$125.00 now standing on the books.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Hicks Hill Road, so-called, from the Taglibeau Place to the Seven Pines Road.

- 21. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from the Lambert Place to the Town Line.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from a point on the new State Highway on West Main St., to the Curtis Line.
- 23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the Voters and Taxpayers of Ashland:

The Budget Committee are submitting herewith their fourth annual report and desire to say first, the different Town Departments have made a good showing, taken as a whole, during the past year. The Overseer of the Poor especially so.

The Highway money raised was not all spent, due in part to the fact snow removal costs during December and January were much below the average.

As the Town Tractor is useless it becomes necessary to provide some Highway Equipment. There is difference of opinion as to what type is best for our purposes. After much discussion a majority of the Committee voted to recommend purchase of a Truck

and snow plow at a cost not to exceed \$3,000.

The matter of improving the Town Hall is still troublesome. A plan calling for an outlay of \$17,000 was presented. The attention of the Committee was called to the fact the Town Debt at present exceeds the legal limits. This confines us to a pay-as-you-go basis, which made it impossible for the Committee to approve the plan. As many feel some repairs should be made, it is suggested at the coming Town Meeting a committee of three be appointed—one by the selectmen, one by the Board of Education, and one by the Moderator, to bring in a plan showing the voters what could be done with six or seven thousand dollars in the way of improvements at the hall. The plan to be presented to the people at the next Town Meeting for them to accept or reject as they saw fit.

The income from the Water Works is much less than formerly due to increase in maintenance costs and to provide for a larger water supply. The valuation of the Town is still downward. The Tax Rate for 1940 will be perhaps a little higher than in 1939.

It is hoped the increase, if any, will be small.

It is the job of the people of Ashland to cooperate with their officials, or the officials to consult with the people and with each other; keep the Town solvent; provide for the necessary Town activities and no more; and keep our taxes at a point where the average man or woman can still pay their taxes and continue to own their homes. We believe this can be done if we continue to work together for our common interest.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Changes in the Teaching Staff

The teaching staff in the graded school is the same as last year with one exception. Miss Bernice Carleton has asked for a year's leave of absence and Miss Eleanor Morrill is teaching the fifth grade in her place until she returns.

There are several changes in the staff of the high school. Miss Walsh and Miss Redden resigned to secure positions elsewhere. In their places Miss Dorothy Luzo has charge of the commercial department and Miss Katherine Kearney of the work in home economics. Miss Luzo is a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College and Miss Kearney of Simmons College with graduate study at Boston University.

The steady increase of enrollment during the past several years together with the tendency to offer more elective subjects in the high school curriculum has made it necessary to employ a part-time teacher who has charge of social sciences in the junior high school. Miss Edna Twombly, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, is employed in this capacity.

School Building Improvements

A major improvement in the arrangement of the high school building has been made during the past summer. Two adjoining rooms located on the second floor, one a small class room and the other the headmaster's office, have been made into one large class room by removing the partition between them. A space above the stairway has been made into an office for the headmaster. This provides an attractive and convenient location for the office, as well as the increased classroom space that partly relieves the overcrowded conditions at the school.

Educational Policy

We hear and read a great deal these days about democracy. The experience of European countries who have tried democracy and failed proves to us that democracy is not just a form of government with a written constitution. It is a way of thinking and believing on the part of people. This understanding and faith, vital to our country's existence, can be fostered in our public schools. One of the purposes of education is to develop a loyalty to the American way of life.

Travelers in Germany and Italy from this country find the youth of those nations full of enthusiasm for their leaders and are disappointed at the thought that there is no such enthusiasm for their country on the part of children in the United States. We tend to take our heritage of freedom as a matter of course, and are likely to lose the realization that it is a precious and costly thing. One educator has said, "To make democracy work we must make a religion out of it."

Experience has shown that it is not enough to talk about good citizenship and to understand the workings of our town meetings, national elections, and the duties of the various officers. Our young people must learn to be citizens by practicing good citizenship. The school that can permit boys and girls to exercise self-control, to make their own decisions, to learn to work with others and not to shirk responsibility, is doing its part to make America a better country to live in.

Recent Changes in School Laws

At the last session of the General Court two important changes in the state educational laws were made. One of these dealt with the education of handicapped children and the other with regulations affecting school transportation.

Heretofore pupils who were handicapped through lameness, deafness, blindness, or other physical defect have been excused from school attendance on that account. Any education which they received has been provided for them at their parents' expense. The new law requires that such children have either transportation to school (no matter how near they may live

to the school building) or, if they are unable to attend school, instruction must be provided for them at home at the expense of the district. This requirement does not apply in cases of temporary handicaps such as a broken leg or illness but only to those whose handicap is permanent.

The other new law has given to the State Motor Vehicle Department the authority to make and enforce regulations regarding school buses. Regulations for this school year (until July 1, 1940) have recently been issued. It is expected that these regulations will be changed from year to year in order to provide greater safety and comfort for children who are carried to school.

Acknowledgments

The school board, teachers, pupils, and other citizens of Ashland have been helpful in many ways during the past year. The contribution of the Woman's Club supplying cod liver oil during the winter months is especially worthy of mention. This fine spirit of cooperation so characteristic of New England towns is much appreciated.
