TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ashland in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Ashland on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the firemen and the expenses of the Fire Alarm System.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars to assist in the purchase of a Resuscitator.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars to rebuild the bridge on Winter Street.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction.
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.

- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Poor.
- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Plymouth Memorial Hospital.
- 11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nurse Association.
- 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars to be held in reserve until such further appropriations have been made and added thereto as will make a sum sufficient to purchase land and erect an Assembly Building near the High School for the benefit of the schools and the public.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, and that the note or notes evidencing such borrowing be payable within one year and from the taxes of the current taxable year.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 156.00 to the Lakes Region Association of N. H., for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 150.00 to maintain a Skating Rink.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 500.00 for repairs of sidewalks.

- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 300.00 for the purchase of additional land at the Town Dump.
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the Voters and Taxpayers of Ashland:

The Town Budget Committee submit the following estimates for the year 1941.

Included is an item of \$2,500.00, in order to rebuild the bridge on Winter Street. The demand for better facilities to care for some of our school activities is insistent, with this in mind, and believing the Town must follow a pay as you go policy, your Committee recommend the raising of \$5,000.00 to be kept in reserve and increased by future yearly appropriations until a sufficient sum has been raised to erect a new building near the High School, to be used in connection with our present school plant and form a part of it. The Town Hall could then be repaired sufficiently to care for reasonable town demands at small cost, and then kept in better order.

The Tax Rate due to the inclusion of the above items will probably be some 30 cents on a hundred of valuation higher than in 1940.



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Education for Defense

A wave of patriotic fervor is sweeping across our broad land. This spirit has encouraged some to enlist as soldiers, and others to go to school at night to develop their skill at various mechanical trades. In Ashland a class in elementary electricity is now being conducted at the high school. It meets four evenings a week for eight weeks under the direction of Seward W. Verrill, as a part of a national program for preemployment training. The duty of our public schools, at this time, is to give boys and girls a better understanding of our democratic institutions, and to instill in their hearts a greater loyalty to our flag and the republic for which it stands. We must realize, young and old, that the greatest service to our country may not demand that we bear arms in her defense, but must require of each of us that measure of tolerance, of thoughtfulness of others, of self-sacrifice for the common good, and of intrinsic honesty that will make impossible the evils of greed and self-seeking that are the real dangers to our democracy.

Increased Enrollment, Decreased Cost

The following table shows the growth in Ashland's school enrollment during the past six years, also the total school expenditures for each year:

This represents an increase in enrollment of 17 per cent, and has made it necessary to employ an additional teacher for the junior high school grades.

Changes in Teaching Staff

Two resignations were received during the summer, one from Ruth Crapon and the other from Bernice Carleton. Miss Crapon has been replaced as French and Latin teacher by Maxine Joslyn, a graduate of Middlebury College, with three years of teaching experience in New York State. Miss Helen Stucki, who has been secured to teach the fifth grade, is a graduate of Boston University, and has been teaching in several localities in New Hampshire since 1932. Miss Twombly, who served as part time teacher last year, is now employed for full time and acts as coach of the girls' athletic program.

High School Activities

A prominent educator has defined education as "teaching young people to do better those desirable things that they will do anyway." If one accepts this definition, many topics traditionally included in the course of study will be omitted, and their place will be taken by things of more practical importance. One of these important things will be automobile driving, for instance. Eighteen juniors and seniors are enrolled in a group now studying traffic laws, rules of the road, etc.

Two periods a week for several years have been set aside for music education. We have had students each year who qualified for the state Musical Festival. This year an opportunity is given during the music period for those with other interests to develop their talents also. Leatherwork and block printing are being undertaken by several students. Principles of tooling and finishing leather products are being put into practice, and much excellent work is being produced by the students under Miss Kearney's direction. Mr. Buckley has a small group interested in fly tying, who have tied streamer flies, wet flies and dry flies. When spring comes they plan to find out in the actual sport, how to use them. The Metal Craft Club in

charge of Mr. Gunn produced a number of very attractive articles many of which were recently on exhibition at the Y. D. Pharmacy.

The school magazine, THE BEEHIVE, is given loyal and enthusiastic support by the students. It is published by the commercial department under the supervision of Miss Luzo. Cooperation from the French and English classes gives a variety of material with which to work. Added satisfaction comes from the fact that every step in the preparation of an issue from the writing of the original material through the processes of mimeographing and assembling is done by the students themselves.

Junior High and high school pupils have been able this year to purchase books from the High School Book League at the very reasonable charge of twenty-five cents per book. If a pupil buys one book a month for four months, he is entitled to one free book. Good classics besides modern fiction and biography appear on each month's list. Seventy-five copies of "Reader's Digest" are being used each month by senior high school.

Items of Interest From the Graded School

We have organized a safety patrol in our school. This is to insure greater safety for the school children when school is dismissed. Pupils from grade six are stationed at the busiest street intersections to guide the pupils to safer crossing.

School work is so arranged that a certain amount of work must be covered each day. If a child is absent from school for a long time or his attendance is irregular, his school work suffers accordingly. During the past year our attendance record has been unusually fine. This record is due in part to the efficient care of Mrs. Fisher in matters pertaining to the children's health. Miss Murphy, supervisor of School Nurses for New Hampshire, has also been of great assistance in helping Mrs. Fisher and the teachers get special care and instruction for some of our handicapped children.

During the cold winter months the children are able to buy a hot lunch for three cents a day. The hot lunch is served very efficiently by pupils of Miss Kearney's cooking class. The children have a varied and nourishing menu. A hot lunch not only makes the child's dinner more enjoyable but nourishing. The child who has had a hot lunch is better prepared to study in the afternoon. All mothers know there is nothing better for a child than something hot on a cold day. Mothers should see the looks of contentment when they leave.

In our school particular attention has been paid to the health of the pupils. During the winter months milk and cod liver oil have been available. The Senior and Junior Woman's Clubs have donated cod liver oil which was given free to those whom the nurse and teachers felt needed it but who were unable to buy it. The drinking of milk has been encouraged. Milk is sold just before recess for three cents a bottle and in some cases given to the needy. In this way more children have become conscious of the value of both these things. This knowledge too has been brought home to some of the parents so that in most cases children not taking cod liver oil at school are doing so at home.

Grade Three read the book, "Meeting Our Neighbors", which suggested the class make a newspaper. Filled with enthusiasm a meeting was held, tasks were assigned and for the following two weeks the grade collected and wrote poems, stories and news. After it had been assembled, Miss Luzo's class mimeographed the work. Then each child proudly carried home his copy of the newspaper.

On the morning of December twentieth, each grade was gathered outside its classroom door. Each grade sang a carol and was answered in turn by another group from a different floor. During music period the four upper grades gathered in the sixth grade room. Under the direction of Mrs. Adams, the group enjoyed singing Christmas carols. Later each class had its individual Christmas program and distribution of gifts. Many parents came to enjoy the programs and see the Christmas trees in each room.

Each grade individually stresses health and health habits in everyday living. An example of this is the "Good Health Store" which the first grade made to help the children understand the difference between good and bad things to eat. Children brought boxes and cans illustrating what could be found in any good health store. They were interested to see how many different things could be brought in.

Some of the most enjoyable class periods for the sixth graders are the ones devoted to astronomy. They invariably end with a request for a "star-gazing" trip. Through such trips the children have learned the names and locations of about half of the first magnitude stars, the identity and mythical origin of the brightest constellations, and the names of the two planets that are now evening stars. A never-to-be forgotten trip was a recent one on which the children were invited to view some of the heavenly bodies through Mr. Packard's telescope. To their delight and astonishment, they discovered that there really are craters on the moon, that the planet Jupiter is richer in moons than the Earth, and that the Seven Sisters have scores of other "sisters" in their midst. The occasional astronomy period with its subsequent "star-gazing" trips is, to the sixth grade, a source of happiness as well as a source of learning. high spots in the sixth grade are the maintenance of a feeding station for our winter birds and the enjoyment of Walter Damrosch's broadcasts for schools. the Music Appreciation Hour.

Building Improvements

Defective plumbing made necessary the replacement of piping and sinks in the high school laboratory during the past summer. A change in arrangement of the laboratory tables has increased the seating capacity of this room, as well as improving its appearance and convenience.

The girls' basement at the graded school is in need of thorough renovation, and should be attended to during the coming summer. The limited space for home economic classes presents also a serious problem. The need of an adequate gymnasium has been a topic of discussion in Ashland, for several years. It is unnecessary to present here arguments in favor of this project, as conditions are well known to all who will read this report. It is to be hoped that the time will soon arrive when hopeful discussion will be followed by action and definite accomplishment. Surely building costs are not likely to be lower for several years to come.

Conclusion

In conclusion I wish to thank you, the members of the School Board, and our fellow citizens for the broadminded interest and patience extended to the schools in our dealing with our very human problems. Our objective is to help children develop a responsible and sane attitude toward the problems of life in and out of the school. In this matter the home has the greatest responsibility, and the general home cooperation with our work is in a large measure responsible for the success of the year.
