ARTICLES FOR TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ashland in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Ashland on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges including expense of the police department for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the firemen and the expenses of the Fire Alarm System.
- 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Aid in conjunction with the State.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Welfare Department including Town Poor.
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Plymouth Memorial Hospital.

- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nurse Association.
- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Observance of Memorial Day.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be held in reserve as heretofore for the purpose of erecting a School Assembly Building or diverted to the Water Works Department for the purpose of erecting a dam at Jackson Pond to insure a more adequate water supply now considered necessary.

The Budget Committee recommend that due to prevailing conditions the Water Department needs be considered first.

- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and that the note or notes evidencing such borrowing be payable within one year and from the taxes of the current year.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for repair to sidewalks.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the purpose of preserving shade trees on Town streets.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00, or such part thereof, as may be necessary to purchase a building for the purpose of housing highway and light department trucks and other equipment.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF TOWN BUDGET COMMITTEE

To the Voters and Taxpayers of Ashland:

Your Budget Committee have this year been faced with some unusual and unfavorable conditions - expected outside revenue will decrease. Requests for large appropriations are increasing.

Unless the different spending agencies, including the School Board cooperate, we are unable to control expenses, except in a limited way.

We believe the proposed project for a better water supply at Jackson Pond is necessary and should be adopted in order to safeguard the Village.

We believe our Police Department expense can and should be reduced materially and that our Selectmen can and should make a move in that direction.

We believe the Town needs a garage, or building, where the Highway and other equipment can be stored and that all the Town Trucks be kept therein when not in actual use.

The amount recommended for Town Highways has been increased \$1,000.00 because of rising costs of labor and material.

The tax rate for 1943 will be higher than it has been for several years.





REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Changes in Teaching Staff

During the summer vacation, Miss Maxine Joslyn, teacher of foreign languages, and Mr. John Buckley, of the junior high school, resigned to accept positions Miss Lillian Grossman, of the class of elsewhere. 1942 at Keene Teachers College, is taking Miss Joslyn's place. Mr. Hugh Connor, for years an instructor in physical education in Rhode Island, has taken over the physical education and coaching, as well as two classes in junior high mathematics. The balance of Mr. Buckley's work is being taught by Elizabeth Thompson, a local teacher of considerable experience in junior high school grades. Mrs. Gladys Frost, who did a fine job as supervisor of elementary physical training was unable to continue this for personal reasons, and the work she was doing has been temporarily discontinued.

School in War Time

More and more the impact of wartime conditions is making itself felt in the lives of our children. Although we may work earnestly to provide the normal conditions of work, play, and growth to which childhood is entitled, it is increasingly difficult to do so.

Your teachers and superintendent are called on to devote many hours to duties quite apart from the job you are paying them to do. The rationing of food and fuel oil, and the sale of war stamps and bonds, represent only a part of our duty to Uncle Sam and the boys in the service. In order to save gasoline and tires, it has been necessary to check over with care all the school bus routes, as a part of a national survey. These routes have been combined in some cases, and frequently children are required to walk partway between home and school. Lack of transportation has also obliged us to curtail teachers' meetings for the duration.

Some benefits to children, however, may develop out of the war emergency. An increased emphasis on health and physical education is one of the important advantages. Many teachers have availed themselves of the First Aid courses conducted by the Red Cross. Much attention is being given to the matter of nutrition more emphasis on mathematics, mechanical skills, study in many schools throughout the country. Special efforts are being made to interest children in gardening under the "Food for Freedom" campaign. Such things as these ought not to have to wait until a war comes; and it may prove worth while to continue them after the conflict is over.

Practical aspects of education, especially as related to war service, are emphasized, particularly in the high school. The progress of aviation demands more emphasis on mathematics, mechanical skills, study of weather conditions, and principles of flight. A new slant on geography has been developed; the distance between two cities may now be measured as a straight line, even though a range of mountains may lie between them.

School costs shot upward rapidly during the course of the first World War in 1917 and 1918. The teacher shortage is definitely more serious now than it was then, and the high wages now paid for various types of war work are influencing the trend of teachers' salaries today. No one can foretell with accuracy what the prevailing rate of increase may be for next year, but it takes no prophetic insight to forecast some increase in the salary schedules of teachers in general throughout the State.

Report of the Headmaster of the High School

As part of the war effort, the government has asked the schools to lay greater stress on mathematics, physics, physical fitness and to introduce pre-flight aeronautics and basic pre-induction courses. Ashland High School is doing its best to co-operate, as indicated in this report.

1. Pre-flight Aeronautics

The course in pre-flight aeronautics follows the outlines prepared by the army and navy. Students passing in this subject will be eligible to take C. A. A. pre-flight examinations for private pilot's license. It is the purpose of the course to qualify students for ground crews, for flight training and, in the case of girls, for employment in the field of aviation. The class has 17 boys and 7 girls enrolled.

2. Physical Education for All Students in the Junior and Senior High School

The course in physical education is based on the Physical Fitness Program sponsored by the United States Department of Education. Classes meet daily. Emphasis has been placed on instructional, intra mural and interscholastic sport. The purpose of the program is to turn out boys and girls who have strength, stamina, endurance, and coordination.

This program insures greater activity for more students. To continue this program and realize the full benefits that are to accrue, certain inexpensive apparatus should be secured. Most of this equipment can be made in the school shop. At the present time there is only one shower bath at school, which is restricted to the use of boys. There is ample room for three showers for boys' use and two or three showers for girls' use. Installation of adequate bathing facilities is a necessary requisite to expansion of the physical education and after-school activity program.

The gymnastic classes are held in the Town Hall. We are grateful to the town officials for making this available for our use. Some improvements in the condition of the stove and chimney are urgently needed, however, as the fire hazard is serious; and drinking water ought to be made available.

3. Advanced Class in Shop Work

The class in advanced shop work made possible advanced cabinet making for those who started industrial arts last year. It is recommended that next year this group be given work in electricity, auto mechanics, and shop practice, the courses to follow the procedure and outlines recommended by the United States Office of Education. The use of generators, electric motors, and two automobile engines rescued from the scrap pile has provided sufficient working material for two of these units.

4. Advanced Mathematics or Refresher Mathematics for All Seniors

Greater emphasis on mathematics will help boys in technical work. A review of arithmetic is also desirable for girls going into nursing. For girls who will take up technical training or take positions in industry it is of great value. All seniors are required to take refresher mathematics in the last half year. This work is individualized according to the needs of each student.

5. Expansion and Adaptation of the Course in Physics

Because of its importance in the armed services and in production work, physics has been offered to more students. It is a difficult subject for many of them; accordingly, by the use of different books and varied assignments, it has been adjusted to the needs and understanding of many pupils, rather than restricted to a few.

6. Hot Lunches

Through the cooperation of the Surplus Commodities Administration, and the generosity of public-spir-

ited citizens of Ashland, a hot lunch program was made possible. A daily complete and balanced meal including a main dish, hot rolls or bread, dessert and milk is served for fifteen cents; and extra milk may be had for a cent a bottle. The lunch room is under the direction of Miss Gladys Page who arranges the menus and handles the purchase of supplies. Mrs. Irene Berry was engaged to prepare the food and supervise the serving. About ninety pupils a day are being fed in this new undertaking.

7. Other Activities

The size of the sewing room limited the activity of the classes in this department, so this department was moved upstairs into larger quarters, and the smaller classes in French and Latin meet where the sewing classes have moved out. The larger quarters allow room for much needed shelving and hanger space, and a large work table, made in the school shop. A new electric sewing machine was added to the equipment, and the old machines were reconditioned. Kitchen facilities were also improved by the addition of a new gas stove and sink.

Activities for the year include dramatics, aeroplane modeling, cooking for boys, script lettering, the Outing club, camera club, debating and dance club. Orchestra and glee clubs retain their organization, but Mrs. Adams' prolonged illness has curtailed their activity. The dance club was discontinued a year ago because it was my belief that the school should not set up, on weekday nights, activities that will compete with the major purpose of instruction. Although this is still my belief, there was no other agency through which the pupils might acquire the social values involved, and the club was reestablished. It is hoped that this can be worked into the activity period of the school day.

Much credit is due the pupils for their enthusiasm in the war effort. Under the direction of Miss Louise Hill, the bookkeeping class promoted the sale of war stamps and bonds as a project. On Tuesday and Wednesday of each week this group is busy before and after school taking orders and delivering stamps. They do all the bookkeeping and statistical work involved. Several times the weekly sales have gone beyond \$100. Eighty percent of the students have pledged themselves to weekly purchase of stamps.

With the cooperation of Mr. Fred Lamond, Town Salvage Chairman, the pupils carried out an intensive drive for scrap materials. The result was an accumulation of 208,000 pounds of metals. The money received from the sale of this scrap was distributed under the direction of a committee of townspeople.

We are very grateful for the cooperation of all who have helped us so wellingly on all school projects during the past year.
