

## ARTICLES FOR TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ashland in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Ashland on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department, including the services of the firemen and the expenses of the Fire Alarm System.
- 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Aid in conjunction with the State.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the Town Library.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Welfare Department including Town Poor.

- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Plymouth Memorial Hospital.
- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nurse Association.
- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Observance of Memorial Day.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be held in reserve as heretofore for the purpose of erecting a School Assembly Building.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and that the note or notes evidencing such borrowing be payable within one year and from the taxes of the current year.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for repair to Sidewalks.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the purpose of preserving shade trees on Town streets.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 16. To see what action the Town will take relative to a readjustment of the Domestic Light rates herein.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to sell the land on Gordon street.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

In the Warrant for the 1944 annual school district meeting, there appears an Article calling for the appropriation of money for alterations of school buildings for better fire protection. This article has been inserted that we might comply fully with the recent law (Chapter 153, Laws of 1943) "An Act Providing for Safety to Life in Places of Assembly". The law seems to apply to schools with an enrollment of 100 or more. The report of changes recommended by the Chief of the Fire Department is given below:

#### High School

- 1. Exit doors on shop to open out.
- 2. Door towards kitchen to be free.
- 3. Inside vestibule door must be kept unlocked.
- 4. Rehang classroom doors to open out.
- 5. Panic lock on side door.
- 6. Recommendation that assembly hall has reached its capacity.

#### Elementary School

- 1. Check electrical system.
  (Underwriters will send inspector when completed)
- 2. Spot sprinkler system in basement.
- 3. Metal ceiling in basement.
- 4. Fire stop at head of basement stairs.
- 5. Inside vestibule door must be kept unlocked.
- 6. Emergency exit from girl's basement.
- 7. Class doors to replace windows used as exit to fire escape.
- 8. Fix step on top of radiator used in exit way.
- 9. Recommendation that regular fire drills be had and a record kept of same.

Buildings inspected by Chief Crowley and Board of Fire Wards and above changes approved by Mr. Clifford Hudson, Board of Underwriters, Concord.

The provision of noon lunches in both the high school and elementary grades is part of a nation-wide movement in the direction of better nutrition for school children. Purchase of food is largely reimbursed from Federal funds. The lunches served, in cafeteria style, have proved very popular among pupils in both buildings. Penny milk has also been made available for some who do not have noon lunch at the school.

Fundamental teaching of reading, writing, arithmetic, spelling and the like go on in war time as always. Geography has taken on a new interest as boys from our town are stationed in distant parts of the world. Weekly newspapers, written on the level of the various school grades, provide timely material for the study of current events. An effort is made to distinguish between true and false impressions in the propaganda which comes to our attention daily.

The work of the schools in developing good attitudes of citizenship and patriotism, and in giving children a thorough background of fundamental skill and knowledge, is recognized as a necessary wartime activity. The War Production Board gives to schools a high priority rating for the purchase of supplies and materials; the War Manpower Commission rates teaching high on the scale of necessary war work. In fact, we all should realize that Hitler and other dictators worked for years to educate their followers while they were still young children, so these boys would become loyal soldiers later on.

Winning this war for the Allies must depend largely upon men and women already out of school; winning the peace, and preventing future wars, will depend in great measure upon the wisdom of those who are now in schools. The teacher in these days has indeed a grave responsibility.

#### HEADMASTER'S REPORT

#### Report of the Headmaster of the High School

Changing political and economic factors in the world necessitate change of emphasis in subject matter and sometimes change of context. Geography, formerly thought of as an elementary school subject, has gained a place of prominence in the modern curriculum. Greater understanding of the war, the peace and the post-war world necessitates a basic knowledge of the people, climate, topography, natural resources and agricultural potentialities of our allies and our enemy. Accordingly, globular geography has been introduced into the curriculum as a required subject. This course will lay a foundation for a new course in current history which is to be added to the curriculum. An increasing need for better understanding of the many influences that are to come out of this war and that are to affect the peace warrants attention.

The value of the general shop course, introduced a year ago, has been greatly enhanced by the addition of several power tools. Among the new pieces of equipment secured are a large bench saw, planer, drill press, shaper and sander. The added equipment serves a two-fold purpose. It permits a better pre-induction training in shop methods for those entering the armed service; it provides basic training in shop skills for those entering industry.

During the past year the Physical Education program was given more emphasis. An increased time allotment and added equipment has involved more students in group games and sports. When we are again able to get outdoors, a program of intra-mural sports will be developed.

During the past year a stove was installed in the town hall. It is a great improvement over the unit it replaced. We are grateful to the members of the

Board of Selectmen for their help and cooperation in making this change possible.

We are extremely grateful for the cooperation we have received in school projects during the past year and for the interest shown in our activities.
