## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

---

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ashland in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Ashland on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To choose a delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

3. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,110.00 to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2700. to defray the expense of the Police Department.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4500.00 to defray the expense of the Fire Department.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for control of White Pine Blister Rust.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the Plymouth Hospital.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1700.00 for the District Nurse Association.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,000.00 for general expense of the Highway Department, \$3,000.00 of which is for Overdraft in 1947 and \$10,000.00 for current year.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$317.40 for Town Road Aid. (The State to contribute \$1,269.60).

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the Capital Reserve Fund.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Town Library.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for Old Age Assistance and Town Poor.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for Memorial Day.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the bathing beach and life guard duty.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Shade trees.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$195.00 for the Lakes Region Association.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for oiling streets.

19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for new road construction; \$500.00 of which is for Collins Street and \$500.00 for Thompson Street.

20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,000.00 for snow removal equipment and authorize the Selectmen to dispose of surplus old equipment.

21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to pay out of the Capital Reserve Fund to Mrs. E. Gertrude Fifield the sum of \$800.00 (Eight Hundred Dollars) for property front-



ing on Highland Street, as per agreement with Building Committee; remainder of Capital Reserve Fund to be subject to Articles 22 and 23.

22. To see if the town will vote to change the purpose for which the Capital Reserve Fund of the town was established from purchasing land and erecting of an assembly building to remodelling the present Town Hall into a combined gymnasium, assembly building and town hall.

(Requires 2/3 vote)

23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the remodelling of the Town Hall, if the preceding article is adopted, into a combined gymnasium, assembly building and Town Hall, and to instruct the trustees of trust funds to pay over the capital reserve funds in their custody to the present Building Committee, who are named as agents of the Town, to carry out the objects designated herein.

24. To see if the town will vote to authorize and empower the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and that the notes or notes evidencing such borrowing be payable one year and from the taxes of the current year.

25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell the Electric Light Plant, line, etc., or any part thereof, this being subject to a vote of the town at a future town meeting.

26. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to sell the Observation Post Building now located on Carr Avenue.

27. To see if the town will vote to establish a Public Utilities Commission, to be elected at the annual meeting, March 9, 1948; said Commission to be made up of 3 or more citizens of the town and to serve for one, two and three years respectively, and thereafter for three year terms.

28. To see if the town will vote to continue the water main from the Sanborn homestead towards Union Bridge on West Main Street. (No appropriation recommended by the Budget Committee.)

29. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

---

### Our School Buildings

Of the 1947 State Aid money allotted to Ashland under the new law, about one-fourth has been devoted to building improvements. Two of the primary rooms have been re-decorated. The space downstairs in the high school formerly used as a school shop has been enlarged and painted and the floor repaired so that it is now used as a school cafeteria. This also provides a place that can be darkened for moving picture programs.

The most outstanding improvement has been at the high school where the main room has been divided into two large class rooms, one of these being equipped as a laboratory for science teaching. For several years inspections by the state high school agent have been followed by the report that our chemistry laboratory was too crowded for satisfactory work. At times approval of our high school has been withheld until we would promise to take steps to relieve the situation. The installation of modern fluorescent light fixtures in the new and larger space makes a very satisfactory work room. The fact remains, however, that no matter how rooms may be arranged or rearranged, the building as a whole is still too small for the number of pupils who work there.

As for building improvements during the coming year, we plan to continue the project of repainting the class rooms in the elementary building and provide several of these with fluorescent lights. Lighting at the shop is also very inadequate and uneven and new fixtures are needed here to protect the students from eye-strain.

### Physical Education

Year by year we feel more keenly the handicap of insufficient space for a physical education course and competitive sports. The new ruling of the local basketball league which prohibits any spectator on the

playing floor at league games has made it especially hard for Ashland as our basketball playing area is one of the smallest of the schools in the league. We look forward with great eagerness to the time when actual work may be begun on the proposed new gymnasium for Ashland.

### **Elementary Program**

The problem of individual differences presents the greatest challenge to the grade teacher with a large group under her care. Every teacher realizes the need for special work with small groups, but the day is short, and the slow learner who needs an hour or more of careful coaching may get no more than ten minutes of individual attention. He is certain then to develop the habit of sitting and waiting for someone to give him help, and this habit of idleness proves extremely hard to break.

Mr. Kimball who is acting as principal of the grade building and spends one-fourth of his day there, has taken a few pupils from various grades for special help. There are many others who could profit from such assistance but there is no place for a larger group to meet. Until a satisfactory room can be provided it is useless to recommend that special groups be taken at various periods during the day for supervised study.

The prospect of increased enrollment which seems to be the trend throughout the country for the next few years will greatly aggravate this situation. The larger the class each teacher must handle, the less chance she has to give individual help to those pupils who need it most year after year.

### **Improvement of Teachers in Service**

At Bristol last December a three-day "workshop" for elementary teachers was conducted; and although the group was limited to 40, they found room to invite the Ashland teachers. The three leaders from the state board who guided the discussion and the work of the group gave many practical suggestions which helped to broaden the point of view of the teachers as well

as to give them specific ideas for making their work more effective and interesting. All who attended were enthusiastic over this plan and it is anticipated that next year more groups of this sort will be organized throughout the state, and programs will be undertaken of interest to high school teachers as well as elementary.

### **Shortage of Teachers**

The supply of teachers, especially in the elementary grades, is still far from meeting the demand throughout the state. Less than 40 are graduating next June from our teachers' colleges with work in this field and the demand in September will call for at least five or six times that many. We must continue to depend for several years upon people who formerly taught and who are willing to go back into this work, and we must try to interest more young people to enter the profession of teaching. Organizations such as parent-teacher associations and women's clubs can assist by sponsoring programs which will help to interest young women, as well as young men, in this profession. It will be several years before the supply can possibly meet the demand in this important field of service.

### **Cooperative School Districts**

A law passed by the 1947 Legislature makes it permissible for two or more districts to join together and pool their resources to maintain schools. Several sections of the state are considering this matter seriously, especially with reference to high schools. It is said that a good variety and quality of high school education cannot be provided at a reasonable cost in a school of less than 300 to 400 pupils. There are many high schools in the state today that are smaller than this minimum. People are giving serious thought to the establishment of larger schools by joining two or more small ones into one unit.

According to the new law, each district that wishes to join such a cooperative enterprise needs to approve this action by vote at a district meeting. Many school districts are including in this year's warrant an

article to authorize the school board or a special committee to make a study of this problem and bring in recommendations at a future meeting. The advantages and disadvantages of such a plan must be carefully studied with reference to each individual district before any definite action is taken.

One result of such a plan for Ashland would be the more equitable distribution of costs. Under the present law a school district which sends pupils here to high school is required to pay only the cost of instruction and no contribution toward the original cost of a building nor of the maintenance or administration of it may be charged as a tuition expense. Every high school which accepts tuition pupils receives as tuition about two-thirds of what it actually costs to build and maintain the school and provide the expense of instruction. Under the new plan, all costs would be equitably borne by cooperating districts.

## REPORT OF THE HEADMASTER

---

I herewith submit the report of the Headmaster of the High School for the first half of the school year 1947-48.

### Curriculum:

The school is most fortunate in having a well qualified and efficient teaching staff this year. The work done in the various courses measures up to and surpasses the State's recommended minimums. Particularly effective and forward-looking are the offerings in the fields of English, Industrial Arts and Driver Training. About three-fourths of our young people will be driving automobiles within the next ten years and Ashland high school is among the first of the schools in the state to provide a course of instruction, including actual behind-the-wheel driving, using a car with dual controls. There are 21 students at Ashland now taking this course. Because not all this work can be done during the school day, the learners are practising during the noon hour and after school. This is a very popular course and intensely practical.

### Guidance:

Pupils are encouraged to explore their interests for future schooling or vocations through the medium of proper educational moving pictures, perusal of literature on the various schools and vocations and frequent conferences with the headmaster on future plans. All teachers attempt to focus attention on what the future has in store for these young people.

### Pupil Activities:

School time is devoted often to the exploration of pupils' interests in avocational pursuits. At the present time groups are actively engaged in arts and crafts, woodworking, boys' cooking, science, dramatics, music and other activities that pupils desire. A coeducational Hi-Y Club was organized this year and much has been done in the frequent meetings and social gather-

ings to promote good Christian living. Pupils are given opportunity at frequent intervals to participate in conferences with boys and girls from other communities on subjects of problems common to young people.

### **Sports:**

As in other years Ashland High School has had a fine sports record. Our track team won, in 1947, the meet which is held at the Plymouth Fair annually. Our basketball team was chosen to compete in the N. H. State High School Tournament held at Manchester. The school was dedicated to the idea this year of improving the relations between ours and other schools in the area. I can report that the feeling toward Ashland by other schools is as good as has existed at any time in our sports history. This situation was helped materially by the splendid cooperation shown by the townspeople in the seating of spectators and resultant conduct at our various contests.

### **Noon Lunches:**

This program under the direction of Mrs. Kimball, home economics teacher, and her assistants, Mrs. Moody followed by Mrs. Harvey, has had a banner season. Approximately 140 pupils, including many from the elementary building, are served daily at a cost lower than would be the cost of a packed "cold lunch." Meat or meat substitutes, milk, a hot vegetable, and dessert, constitute the usual meal. It is hoped that another year will make it possible for us to purchase additional equipment which is much needed.

I wish to thank the superintendent, teachers and pupils of the High and Grade Schools and the citizens and parents of Ashland for the fine cooperation shown me during my stay in Ashland.
