

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Selectmen's Letter

To the Citizens of Ashland:

We are pleased to present to you the Annual Report of the Town of Ashland for the year ended December 31, 1961 and we wish to thank the Citizens and employees of the Town for their co-operation this past year. It has been a pleasure to serve as your Board of Selectmen.

The annual Budget has been presented to the Budget Committee. It is the recommendation of this Board that the Town raise the \$5000.00 as the Town's Share of removing the Garneau Block and the improvement of that dangerous corner. The State is to pay \$10,000.00 as their share.

During the year Police Chief Daniel Golden organized the Civil Defense Auxiliary Police. There is a membership of 15 men and they have served at various functions during the year. They are especially to be congratulated on the very efficient way they handled the great influx of traffic during our gala 4th of July celebration.

Plans for next year include the building of a shooting range so that each Auxiliary Policeman will qualify for the use of pistols. Also, the Auxiliary Policemen are planning to attend a six-week school in Meredith to receive further instructions in police procedure.

The Beach-Booster Association worked very hard this past year and in conjunction with money raised by the Association, received \$3000.00 from the Spaulding Charitable Trusts.

The Highway Department has continued its program for the resurfacing of streets in Town. Much work has been done on the reconstruction and resurfacing of Thompson Street. Also, 4 new culverts were installed.

Next year's plans include a continuation of resurfacing of streets and more work on Thompson Street.

The State Tax Commission did a revaluation of the Town during the past summer, increasing valuation from \$2,716,358 to \$5,214,398. The Tax Rate dropped from \$70.00 per thousand on a 50% valuation to \$41.00 per thousand on a 90% valuation.

It has been brought to the attention of this Board that in the process of arriving at our tax rate that \$12,000 in expected revenue was overlooked in the School section of the Budget, and \$7,450 for Town Manager's Salary was inadvertently put in the Town Budget, thereby making our tax rate \$41.00 per thousand when it should have been \$37.65 per thousand.

The Town's fiscal year ended with a next unexpended balance of appropriations of \$9,162.37, plus a revenue surplus of \$664.79, which gives the Town a net Budget Surplus of \$9827.16. This is returned to the General Fund for the reduction of taxes.

Metcalf & Eddy, Engineers of Boston, Massachusetts have made a study of the Sewage and Sewerage problem here in Ashland. This was voted by the Town in 1957. A preliminary talk will be given at Town Meeting.

Ashland Water and Light Departments Report of Commissioners - 1961

Since this was our first year in office, much of our time has been spent in becoming acquainted with the various procedures and problems of these two departments. In order to accomplish this we have made it our practice to meet on an average of at least three times a month.

In our first meetings it became apparent that one of our major problems was that of delinquent accounts. Our principal effort in this connection during 1961 was in the Electric Department and the program we have set up for collections has been very successful. During 1962 we hope to set up a similar program for the Water Department and feel that, with the proper cooperation of the water users, we will be equally successful.

We made no major additions or improvements in either Department during 1961 with the exception of the construction of a retaining wall and driveway at the reservoir. This was done primarily in preparation for the future repairs and maintenance work which needs to be done on the dam and spillway. Our Water Department Supervisor, Mr. Charles Flanders, has recommended that this work be accomplished as soon as possible in order to avoid a more costly project in the future.

It came to our attention a few months ago that the Public Utilities Commission had requested certain information regarding both of these departments so we arranged for a conference in Concord to find out what was required of us. At this conference it was explained to us that we were required to take a complete inventory of our systems in order to establish a continuing property record and a true valuation of our plant investment.

We have recently completed a survey and map of the Electric Department which shows all of our pole locations and will be used to establish a pole numbering system. As soon as the numbering is completed in the field we plan to start a pole by pole inventory that will enable us to set up a continuing property record. From this record we then hope to age the various units of property and determine the total plant investment by proper fixed capital accounts.

Our first year as Commissioners has certainly been a busy and informative one and we trust that our efforts have met with your approval.

Town Warrant for 1962

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Ashland, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the High School Auditorium in said Ashland on Tuesday the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all the necessary officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. Shall the Provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Laws, relating to playing games of Beano be adopted in this Town. (According to Law this Article will appear on the printed ballot).
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Town Manager Plan as provided by Chapter 37, of the Revised Statutes, State of New Hampshire, Annotated. (Petitioned by 10 legal voters). (According to Law this Article will appear on the printed ballot).
- 4. To see if the Town will approve and adopt the special recommendations of the Budget Committee and vote to raise and appropriate the various sums contained in the report and located in the Budget, as follows:

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and the Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$100,000.00 and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept the street leading from Highland Street, by the Old Town Hall, to Cottage Street. (Land belonging to abuttors will be deeded to Town, if accepted). (Petitioned by 10 legal voters).
- 7. To see if the Town will, through its Board of Selectmen, enter into a contract with Gustave Claveau for one year commencing May 1, 1962, to provide a means for the collection and removal of rubbish and appropriate the sum of \$6,800.00 to defray the cost of same. (Petitioned by 10 legal voters).

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept the street known as Hillside Avenue, leading from Main Street to the L. W. Packard property, said road having already been laid out. (Land belonging to Hillside Development Association will be deeded to the Town, if accepted.)
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to place a stand pipe on Owl Brook Road at a cost of \$250.00. (Petitioned by 10 legal voters).
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to have the Selectmen appoint the Road Agent, rather than having the Road Agent elected by vote of the Town. (Petitioned by 10 legal voters).
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to extend street lights from in front of the residence of Mr. Victor Clark, where they presently terminate, up River Street to the residence of Malcolm Eastman. (Petitioned by 10 legal voters).
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to place a street light at the end of Hill Street between Jordan's Apartments and the St. Agnes Church Parking Lot. (Petitioned by 10 legal voters).
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken by the Town to adopt the so-called Non-partisan Ballot System, the same being now in use, and to see if the Town will vote to adopt in place thereof, the Austrailian Ballot as provided in Chapter 59, Section 71 of the Revised Statutes, State of New Hampshire, Annotated, the Australian Ballot not to be in effect in said Town until the Town Meeting next following the meeting at which such action is taken. (Petitioned by 10 legal voters).
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to give permission to the Ashland Chamber of Commerce to build a launching ramp at the Stone Dam property which is owned by the Town.
- 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax acquired property.

16. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

February 26, 1962

Board of Selectmen Ashland, New Hampshire

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Ashland for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Water and Electric Light Departments, Municipal Court and Library.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1960 - December 31, 1961: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1960 and December 31, 1961, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$23,022.16 in 1961.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures Estimated and Actual: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$13,523.41, plus a revenue surplus of \$2,867.24, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$16,390.65.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1961, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Water and Light Departments: (Exhibits G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4,)

Statements showing the financial condition of the Water and Light Departments as of December 31, 1961, and the financial activity in these departments during the fiscal year, are presented in Exhibits G-1, G-2, G-3, and G-4.

Statement of Indebtedness: (Exhibit H)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1961, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit H.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$16,422.16, from \$6,386.17 to \$22,-808.33, in 1961, as shown herewith:

Surety Bond of Town Clerk:

It is again recommended that the surety bond of the Town Clerk be increased from \$1,000.00 to \$2,000.00, in order that it may be more proportional to the amount of funds received by this official.

Remittance of Tax Collections:

It is noted that as of the close of the fiscal year, December 31, 1961, the Tax Collector had cash on hand in the amount of \$708.91. In this connection, attention is called to the provisions of R.S.A. Chapter 41: Section 35, relative to the duties of the Collector, which requires that all collections made prior to December 31st be remitted to the Treasurer immediately thereafter, in order that such collections may be included in the Treasurer's receipts before the accounts are closed for the fiscal year.

Conclusion:

Report of Public Health Nurse

On March 15, 1961, a Sterneedle Tuberculin Testing Program was conducted in the school at the request of the School Physician. Dr. William Prince, Director of Communicable Disease Division of the N. H. Department of Health, gave the tests. He was assisted by Mrs. Lois Reed, R. N., N. H. Department of Health, Ashland School Nurses and an assisting Committee of local registered nurses. A total of 405 children took the test. These tests were read in five days and all reactors were followed with home visits and tests of x-rays recommended for family contacts. The reactors of the school program and several contacts were given Chest x-rays at Plymouth in November.

A chest x-ray clinic is held in Plymouth by the N. H. Tuberculosis & Health Association and the N. H. Department of Health in the spring and fall. This is a public clinic and all are welcome to attend. Reports of the x-rays are sent to parties concerned and follow-up home visits made if necessary.

Resusci-Ann, a demonstration life size doll, was loaned to Mrs. Straw, the Ashland School Nurse. She gave a demonstration in the school on mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and students had the opportunity to practice. This is loaned by the Safety Prevention Division of the N. H. Department of Health.

I have assisted the Local Nurses throughout the year upon special request by them. Upon request from the School Nurse, I gave a talk to the Future Nurses of America at Ashland High School. The topic was Tuberculosis, how it is spread, its prevention and its treatment. The various tuberculin tests were explained and the necessity of reactors to the test and families following through with chest x-rays.

I wish to thank all who have assisted in any way in promoting the Health program throughout the past year.

Forest Fire Warden's Report

An Appeal From Your Forest Fire Warden

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook — yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness — our carelessness. This, we — you — and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations — hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you —

- 1. Follow the warden's directions.
- 2. Secure the required burning permit.
- 3. Keep your fires under control.
- 4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
- 5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

Everyone will benefit by it.

The Ashland Summer Playground registered 202 children as participants in the program, the largest number to attend since the founding of the playground.

The program was carried on under the supervision of Harold Proulx, Jr., assisted by Lorette Paquette, Lee Roby, and Paul Proulx, five days each week for seven weeks.

On three afternoons a week, bus transportation was furnished to the Ashland Beach, where in cooperation with the lifeguard, Robert Campbell, swimming instruction was given. The largest number on any given day was 105. Every afternoon when weather permitted, the wading pool at the playground was operated for the tots under the supervision of Lee Roby.

The program included five teams of Little League baseball for boys from 8 to 13. Other sports were ping-pong, basketball, badminton, field and track events, horseshoes, volleyball, softball, etc.

Special events included trips to Benson's Wild Animal Farm and Wellington State Park; overnight hikes for boys and for girls; baseball and softball games with Lincoln and Plymouth, home-run derby, tournaments, costume and pet parades, dances, Olympic Day, and a Lollipop Carnival as a final activity.

Ashland Planning Board

Report — 1961

During the past year your Planning Board has held ten regular and special meetings. The two chief objects pursued at these meetings were: (1) 'Planning' aimed at insuring the orderly growth and development of Ashland; and (2) Initiation of several projects designed to encourage such growth and development.

In the area of Planning we have consulted several times with the State Planning and Development Commission and have secured several large scale maps of the town. We are now putting land-use, dwelling unit, water-line, sewer-line and power-line information on these maps. When complete these maps will provide us with the basic information we need to undertake detailed planning for future development. We have begun preliminary discussions of 'Zoning' and are attempting to acquire basic reference materials on this subject.

Projects begun (and in some cases completed) include:

- 1. Compiling of basic information about Ashland of interest to businesses and industries considering locating in this area and the filing of such information with the State Planning and Development Commission.
- 2. Compiling a file of information on local sites suitable for industrial use and available for such use.
- 3. Initiation of action leading to the reorganization and reactivation of the Ashland Chamber of Commerce.
- 4. Erection of three Large 'Welcome to Ashland' signs on the three major roads leading into town.
- 5. Holding of extensive conversations with state officials with regard to securing state assistance in purchasing and demolishing the 'Garneau block' at Main and River streets so as to correct the present dangerous conditions existing at this important intersection.
- 6. Holding of extensive conversations with state officials, the local Chamber of Commerce and the Board of Selectmen on the exact location of the proposed Ashland extension of Interstate No. 93. If we are to capitalize on the opportunities the arrival of the new highway will bring, we must begin to plan for it now.

- 7. Contacts have been made with perhaps a half dozen industries expressing an interest in locating in this area.
- 8. We have discussed the possibility of installing a TV 'translator' near town to improve local TV reception.
- 9. We have discussed means of curbing present large losses of our lovely old elm trees due to elm tree disease.
- 10. We have become convinced that lack of adequate modern housing is a major factor presently impeding Ashland's growth population-wise and we hope to develop means of encouraging the erection of larger numbers of such houses.

The members of your Planning Board feel that other industries are likely to follow the example of Sprague Electric Co. in locating in this area. We feel that the completion of Interstate Route No. 93 through to Ashland will help in attracting new industries, new residents and new shoppers to Ashland. We are convinced that proper planning now is the surest method of realizing the great benefits possible from these important developments. To plan properly we need your support financially and in carrying out such projects as circumstances indicate are needed. We have received such support during the past year and have every confidence that it will be forthcoming throughout 1962.

School Board Report

The past year has been a fairly quiet one for the school department. No major catastrophes have occured, with the exception of the mysterious oil leak. After much digging the leak was located in the underground junction of the vent line for the gym oil tank. The pipe had corroded and pulled away.

The grounds in front of the old elementary school and the Ober School have been graded and seeded. They look quite attractive and the children have been careful not to walk or play in these areas. Grading still remains to be done in front of the gym and vocational building.

Our present enrollment of 426 pupils, and anticipated enrollment in September of 1963 of 460 students, makes us uncomfortably aware of the physical limitations of our high school building. After next years' class of 17 graduates we will not have enough room to accommodate grades 7 through 12.

This year we hope, with the help of a study committee, to look into the possibility of establishing a regional Junior-Senior High School, with Plymouth and other Towns. Initially this would encompass construction costs, but within a short time we should see a very definite decrease in per pupil cost. Educationally it offers a wide scope of subjects for every child. This could result in eliminating the old elementary building, locating grades 3-6 in the high school, with space for remedial reading and help for retarded children. The vocational building could be turned back to the town, with the possibility of having a town office building. All equipment in the junior high and high school, which is in good condition, could be sold to this co-operative school.

Perhaps, if and when this study committee is appointed, and meetings commence, some of you might be interested enough to sit in with us, even if you do not happen to be appointed to the study committee.

The School Board is trying to plan for the future, to secure help for the taxpayers, yet have superior education for our children. We want New Hampshire to become a state where our children will want to live . . . a young, vigorus, state. Your cooperation is urgently needed, not just your votes, but ideas and moral support.

ASHLAND SCHOOL DISTRICT Minutes of March 15, Meeting

In accordance with the foregoing Warrant, posted at the place of meeting within named and a like attested copy at the Town Office, being a public place in said district, the meeting was called to order by Moderator Thomas Pryor at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon of March 15, 1961 at the School Gymnasium in Ashland, N. H.

The Warrant was read and the polls declared open.

Sworn in by the moderator were the following: Beverly LaBrique as Clerk Pro-Tem; Catherine C. Rockwood as Ballot Clerk; Carlton Beard as Ballot Clerk; and Robert Campbell as Moderator Pro-Tem.

At 8:00 o'clock in the evening, the polls were declared closed, and the remaining Articles of the Warrant from #2 through #7 were taken up as follows:

ARTICLE 2

To hear the report of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Action: On motion of Milton Graton, seconded, it was voted that the District accept the reports of the audit of the General Fund Account and Treasurer that was made by the Division of Municipal Accounting of the State Tax Commission, and the reports of the Agents of the District as printed in the annual school report.

Then Mrs. Mary Ruell of the School Board gave a report on the progress of the new Elementary Building, and extended thanks and appreciation to George Ober, Jr., Roger Calley and Norman Lyford for their efforts as Building Committee Members, and to the Lion's Club for its contributions towards the health room furnishings. She stated of the balance left on hand in the building fund of \$3026.00, there was owing the contractor \$2175.00, leaving a remainder of \$850.73, of which the major portion will be needed for grading and walks.

ARTICLE 3

To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials, and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are

estimated to be received from the State Foundation Aid Fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Action: On motion of Catherine Rockwood, seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$142,208.59 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the State Foundation Aid Fund together with other income: the School Board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

ARTICLE 4

To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or offers for educational purposes, which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the State of New Hampshire and/or the United States.

Action: On motion, seconded, of Carlton Beard, it was voted to authorize the School Board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the District, any or all grants or offers for educational purposes which now or hereafter may be forthcoming from the State of New Hampshire and/or United States.

ARTICLE 5

To see if the district will vote to discontinue the publishing of the teachers' salaries in the annual school report.

Action: After lengthy discussion for and against, Mr. Ardine Boivin moved the question, to stop further debate. This was put by ballot vote, the total being 121 cast, Yes 57, No 64, and the motion lost. This being a procedure rarely used in our town or school meetings, it was thoroughly explained by the Moderator, with various assists from the floor to clear any misunderstandings.

Then discussion continued on the motion with fervor and sincerity on both sides of the question.

On motion of Catherine Rockwood, seconded, to see if the district will vote to discontinue the publishing of the Teachers' salaries in the annual school report, the result by ballot vote was Yes 53 No 75, total cast 128; necessary for a choice 65, there being a majority of Noes, the motion lost.

ARTICLE 6

To choose Agents, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.

Action: On motion of Howard Guyotte, seconded, it was voted to authorize the School Board to appoint Agents and Committees whenever necessary. Discussion indicated on this article that such authorization was understood to be for the current year.

ARTICLE 7

To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Action: Dr. Rockwood stated he would like to offer a compromise to Article 5, and make a motion to modify to the extent that salaries would be published but without specific names. After much discussion, Mr. Hiram Gingras pointed out that Article 5 was dead and legally no modification could be made at this time, but only through an article in future Warrant. Dr. Rockwood then withdrew his motion. On motion, it was voted to adjourn this section of the Warrant.

Then the moderator administered the oath of office to Lillian M. Young as Clerk; Harry L. Cote and Ruth E. Morrison and Mary W. Ruell as Members of the School Board as required by law.

- 3. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the State Foundation Aid Fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.
- 4. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or offers for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the State of New Hampshire and/or United States.
- 5. To see if the District will authorize the appointment of a committee consisting of one member of the Board of Selectmen appointed by them, two members appointed by the School Board, and two other legal

voters of the District appointed by the moderator, to investigate participation by the Ashland School District in a Secondary Cooperative School District, and to report to the District at a special school district meeting, to be called for the purpose, its findings including building requirements, program of studies, capital investment, operation and costs of such a district and such other matters as may be deemed necessary.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of the Ashland School District:

I respectfully submit my seventh annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

Staff

The schools opened in September 1961 with four new teachers. Ashland High had one; Ashland Elementary one, and Allen K. Ober Elementary two.

Mrs. Mary E. Bergh, a graduate of Nasson College and a former Business Education Teacher in Bristol and Tilton, replaces Miss Pauline Dallaire, who accepted a position in Hillsboro.

Mrs. Dorothy Guyotte, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College and a former teacher in Alexandria, Plymouth and Meredith, and for the past four years has been conducting a private kindergarten, replaced Mrs. Mary Ann Nielsen in grades 1-2. Mrs. Nielsen was granted a leave of absence.

Mrs. Kathleen Anderson Nelson, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, replaced Mrs. Beverly Zampieri in Grade 3 and Mrs. Zampieri was shifted to Grade 4, replacing Mrs. Jeanette Cote who resigned because of illness.

Mrs. Elizabeth Gregory, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, and a former teacher in Lyman, N. H. and who did substitute work in Berlin, N. H., Puerto Rico, Formosa and Plymouth, N. H., was employed as an additional teacher and has a combination room of third and fourth grade pupils.

Maintenance of School Plant:

The following major items in maintenance of the school plant were completed this past summer:

Kitchen in the lunch room was painted and a hood installed over the range. The outside doors of the gym, shop and high school were painted. The exit door from the lunch room was replaced, and fixed so it will swing out. One of the steps in front of the elementary school was rebuilt and a safety rail installed.

Additions and Improvements:

The area in front of the elementary school was loamed and reseeded in order to improve the appearance. The area between the boiler room and the Allan K. Ober Elementary School was graded and seeded, and also a strip of lawn was made in front of the Ober School. The brush at the edge of the playground was removed and the area smoothed over in order to gain more play area.

Porches were constructed over the exits of the gym to help relieve the icing during the winter and storage cabinets were built under the counter in the science laboratory.

The following items of equipment were purchased: 20 chairs and a table for the Home Arts room, 2 risers for the music department, a record player for class room use and an electric adding machine for the Business Education department.

General Information:

The following legislation relating to education was passed at the 1961 session of the Legislature:

- 1. An Act providing for the appointment of an Interim Commission on Education to study the organization of school districts and the higher educational facilities in the state. Said committee is to report at the next session.
- 2. An Act relative to the operating expenses of Education Television Channel 11. The sum of \$25,000 was appropriated for each year of the biennium and additional sum not exceeding \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962 and a like sum for the fiscal year 1963, provided there is raised and appropriated by school districts in the state sums for the operating expenses of said educational television channel on an equal matching basis. Each School district is assessed 25 cents per pupil.
- 3. An Act relative to education for Intellectually Retarded Children. Intellectually Retarded Children are children not capable of profiting from general educational program of public schools. School districts may establish special classes or pay tuition to approved classes. State will pay a portion of the cost on basis of one-half state average cost per pupil for elementary schools.
- 4. An Act relative to liability for education of children in foster homes provides that children placed and cared for in any home for children shall be entitled to attend the public schools in the district in which the home is located.

Regional High School Study

During the late fall, representatives of the School Boards met at Plymouth to explore the idea of a regional high school as Plymouth High School is operating at near capacity. The Ashland Board was extended an invitation to explore the idea with members of the Plymouth, Campton, Thornton, Rumney and Holderness Boards. With a housing problem facing the Ashland School District in the immediate future, it seemed advisable that the Ashland Board should explore any proposals for a regional high school in the immediate geographical area.

As the study has progressed, it appears that becoming a part of a regional high school program is very feasible and then the present facilities could be used to handle elementary pupils.

After the present Grades 11 and 12, numbering seventeen each, graduate, Ashland High will be faced with classes numbering from thirty-two to fourty-four.

Conclusion:

Good schools are the result of a devoted energetic staff of teachers, nurse-teachers, custodians, lunch operators and bus drivers.

I am indeed grateful for the cooperation extended by all of them.

We are indeed very fortunate in having the excellent leadership of Mr. Kent Bailey as principal of the Ashland School System. His devotion to his duties is shown in the fine way in which the whole program operates so smoothly.

I wish to thank the Fire, Electric Light, Police and Highway Departments for the many services they have rendered to the school system during the past year.

I also wish to thank the School Board for their assistance, untiring efforts and sincere devotion to their responsibilities to the parents, children, citizens and school personnel.

Report of the Principal of The Ashland Schools

To Mr. Martin E. Heffernan, Superintendent of Schools:

The following is my report as principal of the Ashland Schools.

Graduates 1961:

The class of 1961 was graduated June 13. There were twenty-five graduates taking part in the graduation exercises.

The following is the present status of the class of 1961:

Ten seniors or 40% of the class are now in a post-secondary school.

The post-secondary schools in which the members of the class of 1961 are enrolled are: Notre Dame University (1), Keene Teachers College (2), University of New Hampshire (3), University of Connecticut (1), Plymouth Teachers College (1), Carnegie Technical Institute (1), and Northeastern University (1).

We are proud to note that eight of the graduates are members of the National Honor Society.

Enrollment:

The enrollment in September, 1961 for grades 1-12 was 406, an increase of 9 over September 1960. The enrollment in grades 1-6 was 225 and in grades 7-12 was 181.

The size of the classes in the elementary school has made it necessary to form an additional third-fourth combination grade. The combination grade is advantageous to the student because it enables ability grouping.

Instruction:

This year, as in the past, we have made strides forward in improving instruction. This was the first year that the advantages of TV education was available to us. Thanks to the Ashland PTA, who gave the television set, the teachers and students of the primary grades have been able to

take part in the language-phonic, music and science programs. The intermediate grades have enriched their program with "The Granite State", the history of New Hamp-shire on the fourth grade level and also the fifth and sixth grade science programs.

In the high school the seniors have been enlightened in "The Humanities" as it was possible for them to take in four thirty minute programs of "Our Town", "Hamlet", and "Oedipus Rex".

To expand our reading program, three SRA (Science Research Association) Reading Laboratories were added. with grades, five, six, seven, eight, ten and eleven having the use of the kits for one half year.

Special Activities:

The members of the faculty do work in activities outside their regular classwork.

The School Fair during the year 1960-61 was very well attended. There were many fine projects and samples of student work on display.

This past year we sent two junior boys to Profile Boys State and two junior girls to Granite Girls State. This was made possible by the Dupuis-Cross Chapter of the American Legion.

Mrs. Straw and Mrs. Fisher, the school nurses, wish to acknowledge the gift of \$275.84 from the Ashland Lions Club. This money helped to furnish the nurses room with the following equipment: examining table, nurses desk and chair, step stool, waste receptacle, emesis basin, wash basin, and a two drawer file.

Libraries:

The classroom libraries within grades 1-6 received a two-hundred dollar donation from the Ashland Firemen's Auxiliary. The books that this money bought have been enjoyed immensely by the students.

The high school library received \$571.94 from the National Forestry Reserve funds. This sum of money was our share of the \$26,542.06 made available for use in the public high schools of Coos, Grafton, and Carroll Counties (grades 9-12).

This has been a very pleasant and enjoyable year, Mr. Heffernan, and I wish to thank you for your help and cooperation. My thanks also to the Ashland School Board, teachers and pupils for their splendid cooperation and assistance.

Report of the Music Supervisor

This past year has seen a great change in our Music Program instrumentally and vocally throughout the district. The most influential aides to our program are attributed to the school officials and the additional part time staff of instrumental instructors. With this addition we are better able to concentrate our program towards each and every individual participating.

Presently the Music Program consists of a High School Glee Club of 30 voices, Junior and Senior High School Band of 20 members, Choraliers of 12 singers, General Music Program which encompasses the entire Junior High School, and the Eighth Grade Choral group of 12 singers and a Junior Band (beginner instrumentalists) of 30 students.

New within the Music Program are: 1. The two part time instrumental instructors, Mr. Rene de Lathauwer and Mr. Robert Drukman who concentrate their program on beginner instruments. 2. The sectional and private instrumental instruction for the students of both the elementary and secondary schools by the instructors mentioned and Supervisor, Bruce D. Heald. 3. The Eighth Grade Choral Group of 12 singers who rehearse during school on special selections of advanced music. 4. This year the Ashland Band and Glee Club will do its first exchange concert with the Band and Glee Club of Plymouth, New Hampshire. The concerts will be presented in both Ashland and Plymouth as mass Chorus and Bands.

Even with these activities we find a need for further concentration in each phase of the above so as to meet the greatest potential of each.

Sincere appreciation is extended to all who have contributed to our program so as to make it more worthwhile and enjoyable for all.

Vision tests and physical examinations were done on all pupils throughout the year.

Each child is weighed and measured, hair and scalp inspection fall and spring.

This year the stein needle T. B. test was done on 376 pupils by Dr. Prince of the State Health Department. Notices and preparation for same done by nurses. Check for reaction done on all pupils who had test. Children who reacted were taken to Plymouth for chest X-rays.

Children were taken to Laconia Guidance, Mentally Retarded Clinic during the year. Also, to Cripple Children's Clinic at Hanover.

There were many conferences during the past year with parents, teachers, welfare workers, doctors, principal, superintendent and other nurses concerning welfare of pupils.

When any defects are noticed during testing of pupils, notices to parents are sent and follow up work on same.

Future Nurse Clubs held many meetings. Workshops and meetings that concerned the nurse were attended in Concord, Manchester, Laconia and Lancaster.

Many telephone conversations to parents concerning pupils which is time consuming.

During the year 1962 we hope to get our dental clinic on the way.

We were fortunate to have been able to have the chair moved to the District Nurse's office on Main Street. Mr. James Hinds did a beautiful job on painting and repairing the old chair. It looks like new. Drop in to see it sometime.

During the past year there were:

60 children taken home 6 sent home

50 home calls made concerning pupils.

We were fortunate this year to be able to borrow "Resusci Anne" to demonstrate and give a talk on mouth to mouth breathing to the pupils. Some of the students demonstrated after being show.

This demonstration was also made available at a P. T. A. meeting by the school nurse.

Much record work for each pupil is done during the year and kept on file.

Each child has a health record which has to be kept. Many other little duties are done throughout the year for the welfare of the pupils which are too numerous to mention.
