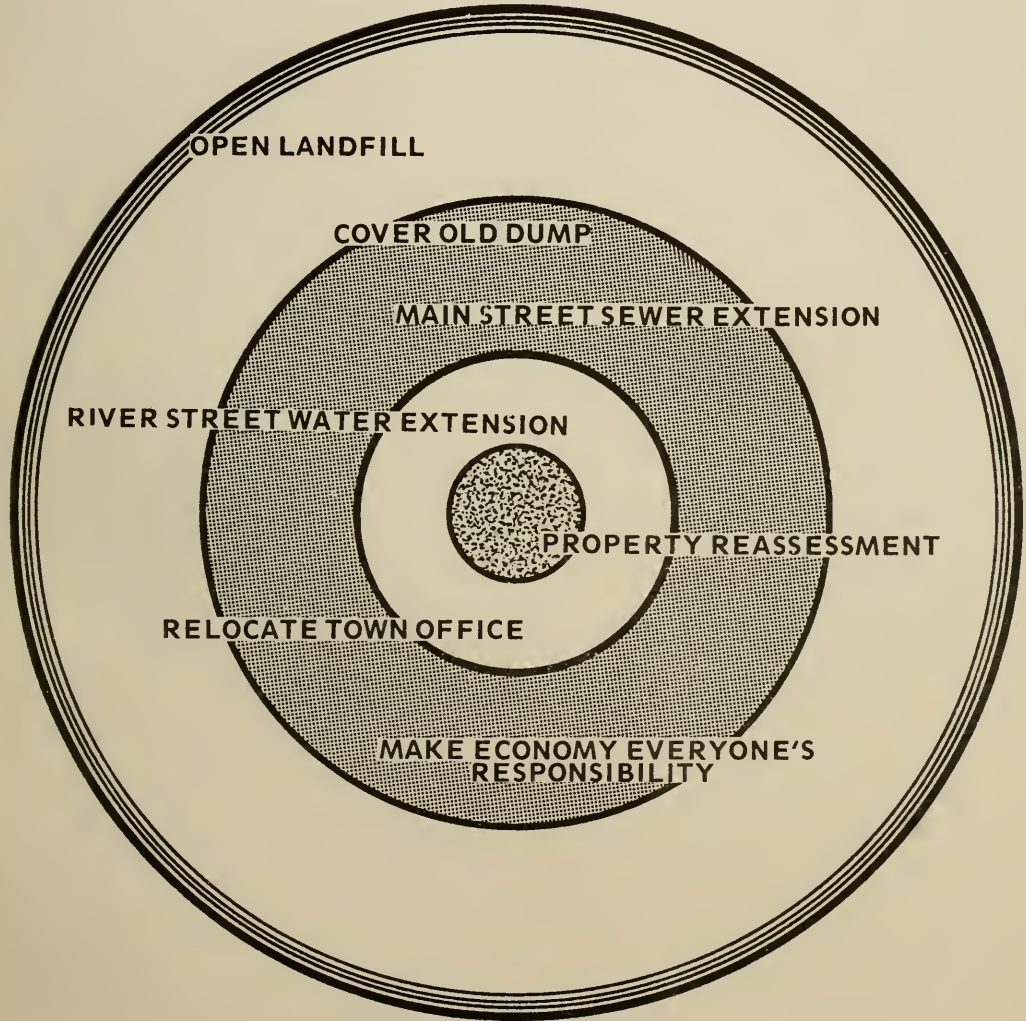

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Selectman's Report

1971

To the Citizens of Ashland:

The Board of Selectmen is pleased to submit this annual report for the year ending December 31, 1971.

The purpose of the report will be an evaluation of the town's fiscal and economic condition, to relate a few minor achievements and to point up the necessity of making many more through the cooperation of all town officials, employees and taxpayers. We recommend a careful perusal of all department and departmental reports included herewith. Such a study should give the individual taxpayer an in-depth understanding of the manner in which your town operates and also an insight into some of the mounting problems it faces.

We purchased a new truck and snow plow for the Highway Department, a welding machine for the use of all departments. The Cote-Gould land was purchased in June and the landfill dump is waiting for development and operation as soon as the necessary money for equipment to operate it is appropriated. The old town dump, of necessity, could not be closed this year. The money appropriated (\$7,000) for this project is still in the General Fund. Through correspondence with the State Department of Public Works and Highways, an inspection of the site by the Highway Department and a detailed measured blueprint provided by the selectmen with calculation of the exact amount of fill needed, we now have the promise of a grant from Federal Junk Yard Funds. The amount is not definite as of now, but we are hoping and believe that it will be sufficient to cover the greater part of the cost of this project.

This year we replaced many of the highway posts and guard rails. We repaired and painted the Winter Street, Mill Street and Owl Brook bridges. We reopened about 1000' of the Hicks Hill Road on a matching basis with the adjoining landowners. We mulched a section of the Hicks Hill Road, the Leavitt Hill Road and Owl Brook Road. We graded, graveled and oiled a section of the Sanborn Road - all of these roads lead to land development projects. We sealed all the roads that were oiled in 1969 (none were done in 1970). Winter Street from the bridge to Depot Street was resurfaced with hot-top at less than the estimated cost.

The total expenditure of the Highway Department will show an overdraft as against the appropriation. However, we received from the state a Highway Subsidy Grant of \$4,613 from the gas tax fund which, if accepted, had to be used on Class IV and V roads. We accepted and used it on the Class IV and V roads already mentioned.

All properties bought by the town at the tax sales of 1970 and 1971 have now been either redeemed or sold. We still own one piece of property from a previous sale which is in the process of being disposed of at this time. We are also pleased to report that the Concel property (paper mills)

has been transferred to a new owner, and with the advent of spring, we anticipate some restored activity and employment as a result.

The Electric Department had a good year with no unusual or exceptionally large expenditures plus some gain in revenue. As usual, the town received \$6,000 from the Department in lieu of taxes. In addition, as a result of office help savings for the Department, the town was reimbursed \$4,000 for the cost of street lighting. This was done with the approval of the Tax Commission, and these two items alone reduced the property tax rate exactly \$1.00 per thousand less than it would have been. A study is now being made and some professional outside advice being sought in order to make the necessary line changes to accommodate anticipated industrial demands.

The Sanitary Department has been blessed with all new equipment and machinery resulting in a much lower operational cost at present than can be anticipated for the future when wear and tear costs begin to come in. The plans for the Main Street sewer extension have been fully approved, but no firm commitment in writing for the money has been received as of this date. We hope to be in a position to proceed with this project as soon as spring arrives. It will be good for the users, should promote further development of taxable properties, and the sewer plant will need additional revenue for operational costs.

The Water Department is confronted with a River Street extension of 2000' to the town beach. This is not a profitable investment in terms of prospective customers, but it may be necessary if the town beach is to remain open. Incidentally, the last \$3,000 note to the Electric Department for a previous water extension was paid this year. Also there is talk already, in writing from the water pollution people about the possibility of all towns having to change their source of water supply from surface water to deep wells within the very near future.

We ask that you study the budget and articles in the warrant and be present at the town meeting on March 7 to express and vote your convictions concerning the ever increasing problems and the resulting burden that is constantly being imposed upon us.

We take this opportunity to express our thanks and appreciation to all those who have cooperated with our constant efforts to bring about more economy in the operation of all our town business.

Town Meeting — March 9, 1971

There were 857 ballots received and counted by the ballot clerks, and 527 cast.

The meeting was called to order by Glenn W. Bricker, Moderator, at 9:00 A.M. and the warrant read. The motion was made, seconded, and so voted that the polls close at 6:00 P.M. and the meeting was recessed for polling until 7:00 P.M., at which time the business meeting would be conducted.

Article I

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Elected by printed ballot were: Selectman for three years - Ernest Paquette; Selectman for one year - William S. Norman; Treasurer - Thomas W. Heinz; Town Clerk - Marion K. Merrill; Budget Committee for three years - Thomas W. Heinz, Daniel Preece, Robert Proulx and Raymond E. Greene; Budget Committee for two years - Christopher Luff; Budget Committee for one year - Richard B. Pytel; Library Trustee for three years - Phyllis Small; Town Trustee for three years - Hiram Gingras; Fire Wards for one year - Albert Blake, H. Joseph Guyotte, Colby R. Lyford; Tax Collector - Elaine A. Hughes; Overseer of the Poor - Nancy B. Straw; Chief of Police - Ernest A. Paquette; Road Agent - David G. Ober.

Article II

To raise such sums of money as may be deemed necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

The motion was made by Mr. Doggett and seconded by Mr. Flanders that we pass Article II until the rest of the articles had been acted on. So moved.

Article III

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$466.76 for Town Road Aid. (State to contribute \$3,111.71) (Recommended by Budget Committee)

The motion was made, seconded and so voted without dissent.

Article IV

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$8,000.00

for the purpose of purchasing a new highway truck, said sum to be withdrawn from the highway capital reserve fund. (Recommended by the Budget Committee)

The motion was made, seconded and voted by a narrow margin.

Article V

To see if the Town will vote to exempt from taxation for the year 1971 the air navigation facility known as Riverside Flying Service, owned by Norman P. Smith, Sr., provided such facility is available for public use without charge and the owner holds a certificate from the New Hampshire Aeronautics Commission that it is necessary for an effective airways, maintained and available for take off, landing, taxiing, open air parking of an aircraft, and any navigation or communications facility and any passenger terminal building available for public use without charge, pursuant to RSA 72:38, as inserted by 1963, 79:2.

The motion was made, seconded and so voted that the article be dismissed.

Article VI

To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of highway no longer in use situated between Old Route 3 and Interstate 93 across from Route 3 Drive-In, so-called on West Main Street, said area about 200 yards in length.

The motion was made, seconded and so voted, as read.

Article VII

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the highway agent. (This article will appear on printed ballot.)

Results: Yes 126, No 371.

Article VIII

To see if the Town will vote to accept the old Town Hall building, so-called, from the Ashland School District, per its vote last March meeting, to be used for the purpose of Town Offices, with the understanding that it will not be used as a fire station site.

An amendment was proposed by Rev. William S. Norman that the article be amended to read as follows: "To see if the Town will vote to accept the old Town Hall building, so-called, from the Ashland School District, per its vote last March meeting, to be used without restrictions."

The motion was made, seconded and so voted to accept the article as amended.

Article IX

To see if the Town will vote to have a Deputy Tax Collector, who may be appointed by the Tax Collector on approval of the Selectmen.

(RSA41:38) The motion was made, seconded and so voted as read.

Article X

To see if the Town will vote to accept the grant of \$4,600.00 plus interest, received from the State of New Hampshire in 1970 for the purpose of aiding in the development of Ashland Memorial Park, and to turn over said funds to the Ashland Memorial Park Commission. (Recommended by the Budget Committee.) Motion was moved, seconded and so voted without dissent.

Article XI

To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of constructing a fire station building.

(a) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 for the current fiscal year for that purpose. (Submitted without recommendation by the Budget Committee.)

Motion was moved, seconded and so voted.

Article XII

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to extend the town sewer main from the corner of Main and Winter Streets through and inclusive to the Lyublanovits property on West Main Street, and to use the sum of \$150,000.00 from the sewer project balance which the Town now holds in Treasury Notes, for this purpose. (Petitioned by ten or more legal voters.) (Recommended by the Budget Committee.)

It was moved, seconded and so voted to amend this article to read as follows: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to study and evaluate the extension of the town sewer-main from the corner of Main and Winter Street through and inclusive to the Lyublanovits property on West Main Street and the tributaries thereto, and use for said study the sum of not more than \$1,000.00 from the sewer project fund presently available and to report their findings to the Town at a continuation of this meeting on the second Tuesday of June. (June 8, 1971)

Article XIII

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to do all things necessary to acquire the land listed in the inventory record as Cote-Goud, 35 acres off Collins St., for the purpose of a sanitary landfill area, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for said purpose. (Recommended by Budget Committee.)

It was moved, seconded and so voted to accept this article with amendment, to read as follows: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to do all things necessary to acquire the land listed in the inventory record as Cote-Goud, 35 acres off Collins St., for the purpose of a sanitary landfill area, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 for said purpose, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,335.00 for the purpose of rodent control and soil renovation necessary to close and camouflage the existing dump.

Article XIV

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to cease all burning at the Ashland Town Dump effective immediately. (Petitioned by ten or more legal voters.)

The article was amended to add "after the sanitary landfill is in operation."

Moved, seconded and so voted, as amended.

Article XV

To see if the Town will vote in favor of the adoption of a Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board. (This article will appear on the printed ballot.)

Results: Yes 168, No 323.

Article XVI

To see if the Town will vote for a revaluation of the entire Town by Private Firm or the State Tax Commission. (The cost for revaluation to be raised next year.) (Petitioned by the Ashland's Taxpayers and Tenants Association, and ten or more legal voters.)

Moved, seconded and so voted.

Article XVII

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Town Manager plan as provided by Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, State of New Hampshire. (This article will appear on the printed ballot.) (Petitioned by the Ashland's Property Taxpayers and Tenants Association, and ten or more legal voters.)

Results: Yes 239, No 249

Article XVIII

To see if the Town will vote to prohibit the Selectmen of Ashland from assessing property for a value greater than the highest bank, FHA or VA appraisal for said property. (Petitioned by Ashland's Property Taxpayers and Tenants Association, and ten or more legal voters.)

Article was dismissed.

Article XIX

To see if the Town will vote to request the Budget Committee to do a financial study of each department and give the Selectmen a quarterly report of their findings. (Petitioned by Ashland's Property Taxpayers and Tenants Association, and ten or more legal voters.)

Motion was made, seconded and so voted without dissent.

Article XX

To see if the Town will vote to elect three Commissioners of Utilities from the floor. One term, one year; one term, two years; one term, three years; then one member each following year for three years. (Petitioned by Ashland's Property Taxpayers and Tenants Association, and ten or more legal voters.)

Rev. William Norman made the motion that the article be amended to read as follows:

To see if the Town will vote to elect three Commissioners of Utilities by ballot at the 1972 Town Meeting. One term, one year; one term, two years; and one term, three years. Then one member each following year for three years.

Motion was made, seconded and so voted that we accept the article as amended, by a count of: Yes 111, No 64

Article XXI

To see if the Town will vote to create a three-man Board of Assessors to assist the Selectmen in all revaluation. This Board to be elected by ballot in 1972, one term, one year; one term, two years; one term, three years. (Petitioned by ten or more legal voters.)

Dismissed without dissent.

Article XXII

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$100,000.00 and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the Town, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year.

Moved, seconded and so voted without dissent.

Article XXIII

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell tax acquired property.

Moved, seconded and so voted.

Article XXIV

To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting. (Petitioned by the Ashland's Property Taxpayers and Tenants Association and ten or more legal voters.)

A motion was proposed by George Ober that the Town go on record as being against any State sales tax or income tax without a referendum voted on March 15, 1972.

Seconded and so voted without dissent.

Article II

The amount of \$17,514.49 for the Fire Department was questioned, and it was explained that \$6,600.00 of that amount was for hydrant rentals and did not affect the tax rate. It was voted to deduct that amount from the total, and a revised amount of \$10,914.49 was accepted, which amount included the amount required for the new Mutual Aid.

The total appropriations for the Town of Ashland at this meeting were \$487,362.75.

The meeting adjourned until June 8, 1971.

Adjourned Town Meeting

June 8, 1971

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Glenn W. Bricker, for the purpose of acting on Article 12 of the 1971 Town Warrant, as amended at the Regular Town Meeting on March 9, 1971.

Article XII, As Amended

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to study and evaluate the extension of the town sewer main from the corner of Main and Winter Streets through and inclusive to Lyublanovits property on West Main Street and the tributaries thereto, and to use for said study the sum of not more than \$1,000.00 from the sewer projects funds presently available, and to report their findings to the Town at a continuation of this meeting on the second Tuesday of June - June 8, 1971.

The meeting was opened at 7:00 p.m. and warrant read by the moderator, Glenn W. Bricker. The following motion was made by Edward Doggett and seconded by Maxim Landroche:

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to extend the town sewer main from the corner of Main and Winter Streets through the Lyubanovits property on West Main Street at a total cost not to exceed \$276,100.00 provided that the project shall not be undertaken until the Selectmen have applied for and obtained commitments for all available Federal and State assistance for the project; to appropriate the sum of \$276,000.00 for this project, and to authorize the Selectmen to expend this sum for this project, including such amount, not to exceed \$75,000.00, which the Selectmen are hereby authorized to borrow on credit of the Town for this project.

Following much explanation and discussion the motion was adopted 74 to 3.

TOWN WARRANT — 1972

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ashland, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Ashland School Auditorium in said Ashland on Tuesday, the seventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon Article 1 hereof, and you are further notified to meet at the same place on the same day at 7:00 P.M. to act upon the remaining articles in this Warrant.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be deemed necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$407.15 for Town Road Aid. (State to contribute \$2,414.33.) (Recommended by Budget Committee.)
4. To see if the Town will vote in favor of giving the Planning Board the authority to prepare and adopt Land Subdivision Regulations. (This article will appear on the printed ballot.)
5. To see if the Town will vote to become a members of the Regional Planning Commission, now organized and named the Lakes Region Planning Commission. The Commission presently has a membership of twelve municipalities and has jurisdiction over planning region No. 6 as delineated by the Office of State Planning. The objective of the Commission is to plan for and encourage regional concern, to assist Town Planning Boards and to provide for the effectuation of projects within, and which extend beyond, the boundaries of a particular town. The Commission will have only the authority conferred on it by Chapter 36:45 - 53, Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, and will be an advisory commission to local governments in the region. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance

6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,094.00 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Lakes Region Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes. (Submitted without recommendation of Budget Committee.)

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000.00 to extend the water main from Candle Court on River Street to the Town Beach, with monies to be taken from the Water Department Reserve Funds. (Not recommended by the Budget Committee.)

8. To see if the Town will vote to establish a regional refuse disposal planning committee in accordance with RSA 53-B:1. Said committee to consist of three (3) members to be appointed no more than thirty (30) days following the annual meeting.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to enter into a mutual agreement with the selectmen of other adjacent towns who might be interested, for the purpose of sharing the costs, operation and use of the sanitary landfill dump. Also to authorize the selectmen to apply for and accept any and all State or Federal grants in aid, available for such a joint project. Also the right to expend such funds as is necessary, within the limits of the appropriation of this meeting, for this purpose.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$40,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing equipment and preparing the site for operation of the Sanitary Landfill Dump, and to authorize the selectmen to borrow from the Electric Department in the name of the Town, a sum not to exceed \$35,000.00, to be repaid over a period of five years at the rate of \$7,000.00 per year, without interest. (Recommended by the Budget Committee.)

11. A. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to study and evaluate an extension to the Thompson St. sewer main, and to appropriate the sum of \$2,800.00 from the sewer project balance for this purpose.
B. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$150,000.00 for the purpose of financing and constructing an extension of the Thompson Street sewer main and other such related

facilities inclusive of easements and rights of way as are required, such sum to be appropriated from the sewer project balance which the Town now holds in Treasury Notes, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply and negotiate for and to accept any State and-or Federal grants in aid for this extension under our present sewer contract. (Petitioned by ten or more legal voters.) (Not recommended by Budget Committee.)

12. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the amendments of the Constitution proposed by the 1971 session of the General Court shall be approved.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,444.00 to extend the water main from Candle Court on River Street to Little Squam Cabins on U. S. 3. (Petitioned by ten or more legal voters.) (Not recommended by the Budget Committee.)
14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, if necessary, to convey by deed, the old Town Dump site to Mr. Wm. Dailey in exchange for the necessary adjacent fill to cover same.
15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Highway Agent. (This article will appear on the printed ballot.)
16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Chief of Police. (This article will appear on the printed ballot.)
17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to petition the Governor and his Council to re-establish our Municipal Court in accordance with the provision RSA 502:2. (Petitioned by ten or more legal voters.)
18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the Town owned Kimball lot on River Street.
19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$100,000.00 and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the Town, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year, from taxes collected during the current municipal year.
20. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell tax acquired property.

21. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

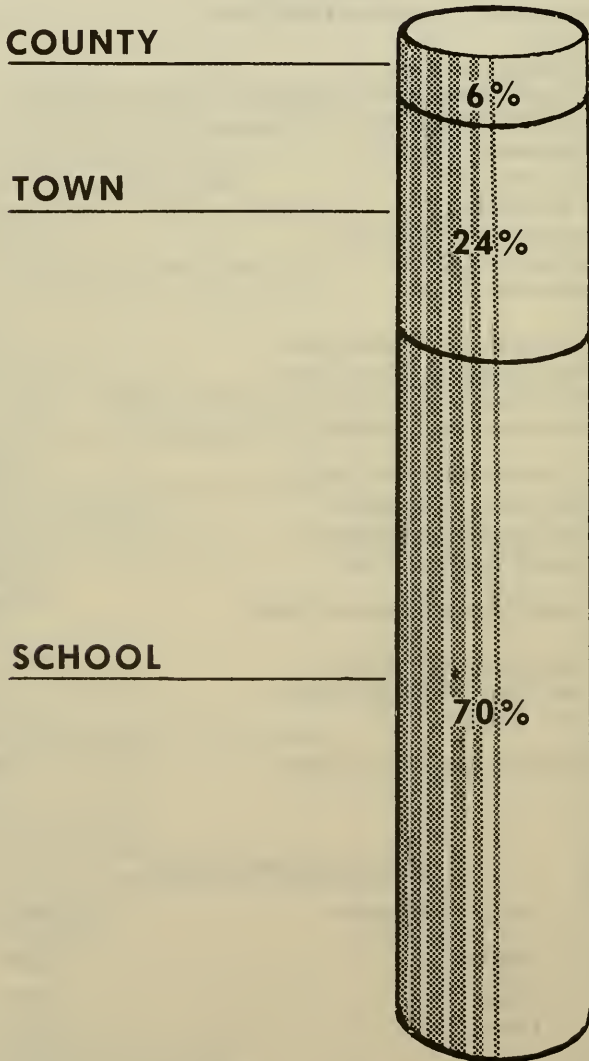

Ashland Police Department

The year 1971 has brought many new items into police work.

The 1971 General Court approved legislation authorizing the use of breath testing machines in New Hampshire for subjects accused of Driving While Intoxicated.

This means that one has to be trained to operate the Breathalyzer Machine. Sometime in February or March I will be attending such a school. This is at no cost to the town. The cost will be paid by the Alcohol Safety Action Project.

Another big item this year is that all local departments must file a Standard Police Accident Form with the State Police in Concord for all accidents.

We have had a changeover in our radio system. We are now on a four channel system which gives us contact with State Police in Concord, all units in Grafton County as well as other towns. We will sometime in the near future have car to car contact with State Police cruisers. We will also have a local channel; all this at no cost to the town.

Many people feel that police work is just taking care of everyday complaints and violations. Police work today is much different than the old days. A police officer today must have training for his job and also be able to take cases before the court. He must study much of his spare time to keep up on the new laws.

Office work today is far beyond what it used to be. Records and reports play a large role in police work.

Visit your Police Department and see just what it takes to operate and keep up with todays problems.

Report of The Planning Board

Ashland, New Hampshire

The Ashland Planning Board's year, with a shortage of four persons on the Board and with little personal contact with town government and other town agencies, for the most part, was uneventful. The Ashland Planning Board should be used as a tool for the better planning and development of the municipality, its land, water, public building, streets and highways, or other areas of change and future growth. It is hoped that during the year we shall find several persons who are willing to serve on the Planning Board in a capacity that will move Ashland ahead in the area of town planning.

Ashland has several continued problems and many possible problems in the making: town refuse dump, bad sidewalks, narrow streets, sewerage disposal extensions, municipal buildings. Land development with complete lack of local controls can prove to be Ashland's most costly problem for the future. Poorly planned developments, steep slopes for streets, on-lot water and sewerage systems with possible poor soil conditions - each can prove to have a definite bearing upon how expensive it will be for the municipality to provide services to the newly developed areas.

The community has not found it necessary to accept past proposed Zoning Ordinances because of one reason or several. The Planning Board, at this time, shall recommend that the town vote in favor of giving the Planning Board the authority to prepare and adopt Land Subdivision Regulations. Land Subdivision Regulations are "Regulations designed to ensure that proposed and subdivisions, including streets and utilities, will be designed and constructed in accordance with both plans for adjacent development and for overall municipal development." Such regulations may provide for the harmonious development of the municipality and its environs. Land Subdivision Regulations do not govern land use and are uniform in application throughout the municipality. Ashland is one of the few communities in Grafton County that has not adopted Land Subdivision Regulations. The adoption of such regulations would be a tool to better development of Ashland's small land size.

The Planning Board would also recommend that Ashland become an active supporting member of the Lakes Region Planning Commission. The community will be given the opportunity to become a part of the Lakes Region Planning Commission at the March town meeting. The Lakes Region Planning Commission is a staffed and functioning Regional

Commission which includes 20 Lakes Region communities. Among the objectives of the Commission is to enable municipalities to join in joint effort of development of the region; to aid and encourage appropriate use of land, such as for industry, commerce, housing; for proper and economic locations of public utilities and services; and the wise and efficient expenditures of public funds. A most important objective of the Commission is to provide member communities with the required regional planning and programming to assure their eligibility for federal grants in the construction of public facilities.

Again, I would like to emphasize the real need of joint community promotion. I would repeat from last year's Report of the Planning Board: Ashland needs desirable growth - a growth that will pay its fair share of municipal services. Certain types of commercial, industrial, and recreational development are essential to a well-balanced economy and to broaden the tax base. Ashland needs a concerned group of business men and women and interested citizens that will volunteer to promote themselves and the community and to establish a Commission that will promote desired commercial, industrial, or recreational growth through good sound development and to meet with potential developers and learn of their needs and requirements. May this be a challenge for the Ashland business community or Chamber of Commerce, Board of Selectmen and the Planning Board itself during the year 1972. The Community's future cannot afford apathy or an unconcerned citizenry if we are to prosper, develop, and mature during our coming years.

Report of the Ashland Historical Commission

During 1971, several major steps were taken in the restoration of the Whipple House Museum. Over seventeen hundred dollars, raised through rental income and activities sponsored by the Ashland Historical Society, was expended on these repairs and improvements.

Two rooms have been completely restored in an authentic and tasteful manner to their 1830 vintage. In both rooms, the old ceilings were removed and new ceilings were installed by volunteers under the direction of Paul Proulx. The woodwork was refinished and painted and the walls were restored and papered by Al Puffer, a professional interior decorator. James Rollins, Sr., an outstanding craftsman, donated his time and effort in restoring the floors to their original beauty.

During the Fall of 1970, the roofs were shingled by volunteers under the supervision of Kenneth Forbes. In the Summer of 1971, all of the sheet metal roofing was completely replaced by Caswell and Son, a Laconia sheet metal firm. The roofs are now in excellent condition and any maintenance problems should be eliminated for many years.

Will Richard, who is renting one-half of the twelve-room house, has restored the kitchen and a bedroom which his family now occupies. The grounds were improved through the efforts of David Ruell who repaired and painted the white fence in front of the Whipple House.

Our plans for 1972 include completing the restoration of the kitchen, pantry and shed so that exhibits can be set up in these five restored rooms. It was disappointing to us that we were unable to open the museum to the public last summer due to a variety of unforeseen circumstances. However, work by volunteers will resume this spring and the museum will be opened to the public on a regular schedule beginning early this summer.

This entire project has been placed on a self-sustaining basis so that no tax funds would be required. How can you help support this community project? You can volunteer your services on work days that will be scheduled this spring. You can join the Ashland Historical Society and support its fund-raising activities. You can purchase any of the centennial mementos that are still available. You can send a donation to John R. Smith, the Society's treasurer.

In closing this report, the members of the Ashland Historical Commission wish to extend their sincere appreciation to all those who have assisted in the restoration of the Whipple House Museum, with special thanks given to James Rollins, Sr., Paul Proulx, Kenneth Forbes, David Ruell and Will Richard. Ashland Beach-Booster Association Report

The Ashland Beach-Booster Association, organized to develop and promote a recreation program and recreation-oriented activities in the Town of Ashland, became 25 years old during 1971. It is planned to have an appropriate program calling attention to 25 years of community service by the Ashland Beach-Booster Association during the early Summer of 1972.

The activities have been many during the past year. It is perhaps impossible to put a value on recreation for youth in terms of dollars and cents. However, many would try to do just this. In terms of money, the Town of Ashland appropriated \$2,900.00 last year for Parks and Recreation. The Booster Club contributed over \$2,200.00 for a total of more than \$5,000.00 to provide ski instruction, playground supervision, fun reading program, arts and crafts, teen dancing, full time beach lifeguard, swimming instruction, away from home trips for youth, bussing to and from the beach, Fourth of July celebration with gigantic fireworks display, building repair, painting and improvements, grass cutting, new picnic area fireplaces and tables, plus many hours of free labor by interested townspeople in doing the necessary tasks of cleaning, raking, painting, or spreading sand. The money to carry on these activities was raised through fund raising activities, rent of building, membership dues, beach fees, etc. It has been said that what a community does not spend on providing recreational opportunities for its youth, it will spend on police activities relating to youth problems and delinquency.

The community is very fortunate to have the activities of the Ashland Beach-Booster Association and more fortunate to have the outstanding recreational facilities that are available through the support, hard work, and monies of many dedicated citizens through the past 25 years.

Through a grant from the Spaulding Potter Trust Fund, the Summer program was able to enlarge its activities with a child fun reading program, special craft instruction, and a Science Center lecture program. It is hoped that this type of summer program will be continued. Other outstanding activities included professional ski instruction for beginners through advanced intermediates and a qualified Red Cross swim instruction program. It is hoped, in the future to offer adult tennis instruction at near-by courts and a desire that money may be raised to construct two tennis courts at the local playground. The past has proven that if we want tennis courts badly enough, we will find a way to acquire the money and labor to construct them. Won't you please take an active interest in your community's recreation activities and support your Ashland Beach-Booster Association and its program.

Report of the Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

Lest We Forget - It Can Happen Here

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar-holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947 nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carelessness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand — a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.

2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.

3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them dead out when leaving.

4. Most important — instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year - 1971 - was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

Annual School District Meeting

Minutes

March 6, 1971

In accordance with the School District Warrant, legalised signed by the Ashland School Board and posted February 19, 1971, by Patricia W. Heinz, Chairman, the meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Dr. Glenn W. Bricker, at 8:00 p.m., at the Ashland School Auditorium-Gymnasium. The warrant was read by the Moderator. He asked if there were any questions relevant to the warrant.

J. Carleton Beard, Patricia Heinz, Mary Ruell,, Jean Ober, and Mary Bilheimer were sworn in as Ballot Clerks at 9:30 p.m.

ARTICLE 1. The Building Committee Chairman reported, and a motion was duly made, seconded, and adopted to accept the reports of the Agents and Auditors as printed in the Annual School Report.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the District will vote to establish a three member School Board effective in 1972. To see how the District will vote to bring about this change. (Petitioned by the Ashland's Property Taxpayers and Tenants Association and ten or more legal voters.)

A motion was made and seconded to dismiss the above article, with discussion following. A ballot vote was requested, with the request rescinded. Moderator asked the question, with the motion of dismission Article 2 adopted.

ARTICLE 3. A motion was made, seconded and adopted unanimously that the District deed to Mrs. Cilley the piece of land adjoining her property 10 feet wide on School Street and extended to zero feet wide at the back corner marker. Said strip of land is between the roadway to the School grounds and the Cilley property. The deeding of this piece of land is to be in partial exchange for the deeding of a strip of land to the School District on the back lot line measuring 10 feet by 96 feet by 30 feet by 94.14 feet.

ARTICLE 4. A motion was made, seconded, and so voted that the budget be discussed line by line. The Moderator asked that, if at the beginning of each group, voters wanted line discussion, to request it. The results were as follows:

A standing ovation by the body, for Mrs. Mary Ruell for serving on the School Board for sixteen years.

Discussion followed on several subjects pertaining to the school system.

A motion was made, seconded, and defeated to adjourn the meeting. Further discussion followed on the school debt, with another motion to adjourn made, seconded, and so voted. The Moderator, declared the meeting adjourned at 9:17 p.m.

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the Ashland School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1971, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the District. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board, School District Treasurer, School Lunch Fund and the Student Activities Fund.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Revenue Accounts

Comparative Balance Sheets - General Fund: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets - General Fund - as of June 30, 1970 and June 30, 1971, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt of the District increased by \$323,252.94, from \$28,862.24 to \$352,115.18, during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1971.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition - General Fund: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition - general fund - of the School District during the fiscal year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues - General Fund: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues - general fund - for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1971, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,994.44 plus a revenue surplus of \$1,972.35 resulted in a net budget surplus of \$3,966.79.

NON-REVENUE FUNDS

Comparative Balance Sheets-Building Fund: (Exhibit A-5)

Comparative Balance Sheets-Building Fund - as of June 30, 1970 and June 30, 1971, are presented in Exhibit A-5. As indicated therein, the unappropriated surplus, as of June 30, 1971, amounted to \$4,048.55. This sum represents premium and accrued interest on bonds issued as well as forfeited deposits on plans and specifications. These surplus funds may be used for building fund purposes only if specifically authorized by vote of the School District.

TREASURER'S ACCOUNTS

Classified Statement of Receipts and Expenditures - General Fund: (Exhibit B-1)

A classified statement of general fund receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1971, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance - general fund - as of June 30, 1971, is indicated in Exhibit B-2

Building Fund:

Exhibits B-3 and B-4 disclose the activity in the Building Fund account during the year and the reconciled balance at June 30, 1971.

MISCELLANEOUS

Statement of School Tax Account: (Exhibit E)

A statement of the school tax account with the Town of Ashland is presented in Exhibit E. As indicated therein, as of June 30, 1971, the School District had received from the Town the total of the 1970-71 School Tax amounting to \$288,355.46, plus total prepayments of \$9,927.24 on account of the 1971-72 School Tax.

Statement of Bonded Debt: (Exhibit F)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the School District as of June 30, 1971, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit F.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Approval of Installment Contracts:

Our sampling of vendor invoices paid in 1970-71, revealed that the School District has entered a three year purchase agreement with a vendor for the purchase of certain equipment. In our opinion, such an installment contract creates long term indebtedness and requires prior approval by the voters of the School District, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (R.S.A., Chapter 33).

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or a summary of the findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the School District.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Ashland School District for their assistance during the course of the audit.

Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Ashland:

I hereby submit the seventeenth Annual Report as Superintendent of the Ashland School District.

The Ashland School District is a part of the Inter-Lakes Supervisory Union No. 2. The Inter-Lakes Cooperative School District, which consists of the towns of Center Harbor, Meredith and Sandwich, is the other district in the Supervisory Union. As of July 1, 1972, the Newfound Area School District will be a part of Supervisory Union No. 2.

The Newfound Area School District comprises the towns of Alexandria, Bridgewater, Bristol, Danbury, Groton, Hebron and New Hampton.

With the enlarging of the Supervisory Union an Assistant Superintendent will be added, and the voters in the individual districts at the Annual Meeting will vote to see if they will approve the additional services of a Business Administrator for the Union office.

The operating budget and apportionment of expenses are printed at the end of this report.

Staff

The following is a list of changes in the Staff:

Elementary—

Mrs. Caroline N. Boyle, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and a former teacher in Idaho replaced Mrs. Dorothy Morton in grade 1. Mrs. Morton retired in June after having been a member of the Ashland teaching staff for 22 years and prior to that taught in Holderness, Epping and North Stratford for 15 years.

Mrs. Mildred Uhlman, a graduate of Plymouth State College and a former member of the Ashland Staff returned and replaced Mrs. Elizabeth Currier in grades 5-6 as Mrs. Currier accepted a position in the Woodsville School District.

Mrs. Margaret E. Kleinfelder, a graduate of Plymouth State College and a former teacher in Bristol and Wells River, Vermont replaced Miss Sara Adams in grades 5-6. Miss Adams accepted a position in the Gilford School District.

Mr. Richard Sullivan, who attended Boston State College and graduated from Belknap College, replaced Mrs. Judith Stewart in the departmentalized grade 5-6 set-up.

High School—

Mr. Rob Roy Macgregor, a graduate of Belknap College, replaced Mrs. Candace Raymond as teacher of English in grades 7-8. Mrs. Raymond resigned to be at home.

Mr. David Conboy, a graduate of Plymouth State College, is teaching the Science classes as Mrs. Helen Steele resigned to be at home.

Special Staff Members—

Mrs. Frances E. Lamm, a graduate of State University of New York is teaching the classes in Art grades 1-12 as Mrs. Rachel Hopkins accepted a full time position in the Plymouth School System.

Miss Ann C. Whitney, a graduate of Plymouth State College, is the Physical Education teacher and Coach of girls' sports in grades 1-12. She replaced Miss Amy Glendinning who resigned to accept a position in the Peace Corps.

Mrs. Joyce Sobetzer, a graduate of the University of Michigan, is the Librarian for grades 1-12 and is replacing Mrs. Marjorie Clarke who resigned to be at home.

Costs

The property tax assessment for 1971-72 School Year was \$331,661.45 an increase over the previous assessment which was \$288,355.46.

The district has received \$20,508.67 in Foundation Aid, a reduction of \$22,447.14 from the previous year of 1970-71.

The Building Aid allocation was reduced from \$7,546.02 to \$4,155.06; \$4,765.87 was received from the Sweepstakes which is an increase of \$2,564.55. These monies have been used to reduce the property assessment for the 1971-72 School Year.

The anticipated revenue will be less this year as the Ashland School District will not qualify for foundation aid because of the increases in the Equalized Valuation from \$8,327,583 to \$13,301,454.

The cost per pupil as computed by the State Department of Education for the 1970-71 School Year, excluding transportation and capital outlay was as follows: grades one to six \$528.33, grades seven and eight \$1,037.96 and grades nine to twelve \$1,002.59.

The State average costs were as follows: grades 1-6 \$665.00, grades 7-8 \$799.00, and grades 9-12 \$896.00.

Buildings and Grounds

The addition to the Allen K. Ober Elementary School and the Glidden Vocational Building have proven to be a big asset in the educational

program as the high school has only grades 9-12, with a Business Education area, Language Arts, Social Studies, Science, Math and Foreign Language rooms.

The pupils in grades 7-8 are in the former elementary building occupying 4 rooms for Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies.

The Library and Instructional Material Center for grades 1-12 is in the addition to the Ober School with a room for Art for grades 1-12.

The additional space for Industrial Arts and Home Arts in the Glidden Vocational Building has made it possible to offer more experience in the Vocational area.

The Music Department has been shifted from the Gymnasium to the Multipurpose Room in the Glidden Vocational Building, and this has proven to be very satisfactory as the Physical Education program has been expanded for the elementary pupils.

Conclusion:

At this time I wish to express my appreciation to the Selectmen and members of the Highway, Electrical, Water and Police Departments for their continued cooperation and assistance in handling the many details that pertain to their respective departments.

I wish to compliment the Administration and Teaching Staff for the excellent job that is being done in the classrooms and the various activities.

I also wish to commend the School Nurse, Lunch Program personnel, Custodians, and Bus Drivers for their fine cooperation and devotion to their duties.

The School Board is responsible for the continued improvement of education for all children, and the Ashland Board is certainly very devoted to their duties in the time that they spend in meetings shaping policies and guiding the operation of the schools.

Education is the key to the future and only the future can determine the true worth of education.

Principal's Annual Report

Full utilization of the new buildings, as an aid to improved instruction, has been the goal of the administration this year. Control of communication is now centered in the Principal's office. Audio-Visual materials for the entire system have been inventoried and cataloged in the Media Center. Our Library now has close to 4000 volumes. The curriculum schedule has been revised so that academic classes come in the morning when students are most rested. In cooperation with the U.S.D.A., the woodland property, donated to the school, is now being used as an outdoor laboratory.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Much effort has been directed toward teaching reading in the lower grades. Pupils proceed at their optimum individual rate within the same class. Parent conferences have been more meaningful for all students in Grades 1-3. These have been found to be more meaningful and to have greater relevance than report cards alone. On the basis of a year's experience and upon recommendation of the teachers, the 4th Grade has been returned to a self-contained classroom. Grades 5 and 6 will continue to be departmentalized in order to help bridge the gap between Elementary and Junior High. Full time guidance service has contributed greatly to early diagnosis and alleviation of problems and the special education program is working in close cooperation with both guidance and the Principal's office. Federal funds were obtained to replace monies from the State for the Teacher-Aide. Finally, in order to offer increased time for Physical Education to the Elementary students, Physical Education has become an elective for the Juniors and Seniors.

HIGH SCHOOL

Probably the most rewarding news this year is that Ashland High School has been designated as a Provisional Comprehensive Secondary School. This was largely due to the expansion of our Vocational and Library areas. This past fall a Cooperative Work-Study Program was begun. This permits a student to continue his academic program at school while participating in some kind of gainful employment. This expands learning to include "on the job" training. Supervisors rate the students on attendance, attitude and performance. We have six boys involved at present and hope to expand the program to include girls.

The student Council has actively participated in community and school improvement as witness the wonderful effort on Earth Day. They are now engaged in painting and refurbishing the Studyhall.

Last summer the Neighborhood Youth Corps financed the hiring of seven students who worked all summer with the custodian in renovating, cleaning and performing all kinds of maintenance tasks.

Finally, the integration of the Home Economics and Industrial Arts

classes for both boys and girls is helping to promote a realistic approach to adult life.

The Town of Ashland is indeed fortunate to have such a dedicated and experienced faculty and staff. Retaining capable personnel is a problem with all school systems today. I believe Ashland has slowed this trend and is stronger for so doing.

I truly appreciate my "adopted town," and on behalf of the children, thank the parents, citizens, School Board, Superintendent and Faculty for their understanding and freely given assistance.
