## ASHLAND BUDGET COMMITTEE JANUARY 9, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 6 p.m. in the conference room at 6 Collins Street.

School Budget. Hughes explained the \$1000 for the care of the Town ball fields was spent directly by the School District on the field work and supplies, etc. done by school employees.

On a motion by Ruell, seconded by Unangst, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$1,851,254 for Regular Education.

On a motion by Unangst, seconded by Ruell, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$525, 668 for Special Education.

On a motion by Ruell, seconded by Unangst, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$17,507 for Extended School Year.

On a motion by Ruell, seconded by Unangst, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend Article 2 in the School District Warrant for the salaries of School District Officers, as presented.

Town Budget. Hughes reported that the selectmen had voted to increase the amount in the Ambulance budget from \$40,664 to \$116,664. On a motion by Ruell, seconded by Unangst, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$116,664 for Ambulance.

Hughes also reported changes in the default budget for Public Works and the correction of a typo in Parks & Recreation default budget.

The Public Works budget had been previously tabled for questions. On a motion by Unangst, seconded by Ruell, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$292,073 for Public Works.

The Town Mechanic budget had also been previously tabled for questions. On a motion by Ruell, seconded by Unangst, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$115,727 for Town Mechanic.

On a motion by Barney, seconded by Ruell, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$3,522,311 for the entire Town Budget.

## Utility Budgets.

On a motion by Ruell, seconded by Unangst, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$399,381 for the Water Department budget.

On a motion by Unangst, seconded by Ruell, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$817,689 for the Sewer Department budget.

On a motion by Ruell, seconded by Unangst, it was voted 4 to 0 to recommend \$3,443,990 for the Electric Department budget.

Hughes noted that there may be two openings on the Budget Committee, as it was not clear whether either of the incumbents up for reelection will run.

The next meeting on Wednesday will consider the Town warrant articles, which have not yet been sent to the Committee.

The public hearing will be held at 6 p.m. on Thursday, January 11 in the school cafeteria.
